A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PHARMACISTS PRESCRIBING AND DISPENSING OF OPIOID ANTAGONIST.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. During the 2018 legislative session, the 2 legislature addressed the nationwide opioid epidemic by 3 authorizing pharmacists, who received the appropriate education and training, to prescribe and dispense opioid antagonist to 4 patients who are at risk for an opioid overdose or family member 5 or caregiver of an individual at risk for an opioid overdose. 6 The legislature found that pharmacists are well situated to 7 provide education and access to opioid antagonists to assist 8 with the prevention of addressing opioid overdoses in Hawaii. 9 10 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to clarify the name 11 on the prescription for the opioid antagonist, whether it is the 12 individual who is at risk for an opioid overdose or the name of the family member or caregiver of an individual who is at risk 13 for an opioid overdose who is requesting the opioid antagonist. 14 15 Section 461-11.8, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is SECTION 2.

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1 "[+] §461-11.8[+] Opioid antagonist; authority to prescribe 2 and dispense; requirements. (a) A pharmacist may prescribe and 3 dispense an opioid antagonist to an individual who is at risk 4 for an opioid overdose or a family member or caregiver of an 5 individual who is at risk of an opioid overdose regardless of 6 whether the individual has evidence of a previous prescription 7 for an opioid antagonist from a practitioner authorized to 8 prescribe opioids. The opioid antagonist prescribed and 9 dispensed for a family member or careqiver of an individual who 10 is at risk for an opioid overdose may be prescribed and 11 dispensed in the name of the individual who is to be treated 12 with the opioid antagonist or in the name of the individual who is requesting the opioid antagonist, or "Opioid Antagonist 13 Recipient" or "OAR". 14 15 (b) A pharmacist who prescribes and dispenses opioid 16 antagonists pursuant to subsection (a) shall: 17 Complete a training program related to prescribing (1)18 opioid antagonists that is approved by the 19 Accreditation Council for Pharmacy Education (ACPE), a 20 curriculum-based program from an ACPE-accredited

3	(2)	Provide the individual who is receiving the opioid
4		antagonist with information and written educational
5		material on risk factors of opioid overdose, signs of
6		an overdose, overdose response steps, and the use of

9		is at risk for an opioid overdose, family member, [or]
10		caregiver, or individual requesting the opioid
11		antagonist as soon as practicable after the pharmacist
12		issues the prescription."
