#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. Chapter 321, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by	y adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to read as follows:	
4	" <u>§32</u> :	1- Opioid treatment programs; regulation;
5	enforcemen	nt. (a) The department of health shall establish and
6	enforce ru	ules for the regulation of opioid treatment programs
7	within the	e State.
8	(b)	The rules established by the department shall comply
9	with applicable state and federal laws and, at a minimum, shall	
10	establish	<u>.</u>
11	(1)	Criteria for the certification of an opioid treatment
12		program;
13	(2)	Procedures to identify individuals who divert opioid
14		treatment medications from their intended treatment or
15		prescribed use and to terminate the treatment of those
16		individuals;

1	(3) Requirements for the random drug testing of patients	
2	in an opioid treatment program, and specify the drugs	
3	for which the tests are being administered to detect;	
4	(4) Regulatory fees for an opioid treatment program; and	
5	(5) Penalties for violations."	
6	SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general	
7	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much	
8	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2019-2020 and the	
9	same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year	
10	2020-2021 for the regulation of opioid treatment programs.	
11	The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department	
12	of health for the purposes of this Act.	
13	SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.	
14	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2019.
