BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. Chapter 339, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated

 and to read as follows:
- 5 A full-service restaurant shall not provide a single-use plastic 6 straw to a consumer unless requested by the consumer.

Single-use plastic straws; prohibited acts.

- (b) Any full-service restaurant who violates this section

 8 shall be issued a notice of violation by the director for the

 9 first and second violations. For any subsequent violations, a

 10 full-service restaurant shall be subject to a fine imposed by

 11 the director of \$25 per day of violation, not to exceed \$300
- 12 during any calendar year. Any action taken to impose or collect
- the fines provided for in this section shall be considered a
- 14 civil action.

- (c) This section shall take precedence over and preempt
- 16 all contrary ordinances or rules adopted by a county or any
