### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SINGLE-USE PLASTIC STRAWS.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 339, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to read as follows:
4	<b>§339-</b> Single-use plastic straws; prohibited acts. (a)
5	A full-service restaurant shall not provide a single-use plastic
6	straw to a consumer unless requested by the consumer.
7	(b) Any full-service restaurant who violates this section
8	shall be issued a notice of violation by the director for the
9	first and second violations. For any subsequent violations, a
10	full-service restaurant shall be subject to a fine imposed by
11	the director of \$25 per day of violation, not to exceed \$300
12	during any calendar year. Any action taken to impose or collect
13	the fines provided for in this section shall be considered a
14	civil action.
15	(c) This section shall take precedence over and preempt
16	all contrary ordinances or rules adopted by a county or any

3	(d)	For purposes of this section:
4	"Con	sumer" means a person who is a member of the public,
5	takes pos	session of food or beverages, is not functioning in the

8	"Ful	l-service restaurant" means an establishment with the
9	primary b	usiness purpose of serving food, where food may be
10	consumed	on the premises, and where all of the following actions
11	are taken	by an employee of the establishment:
12	(1)	The consumer is escorted or assigned to an assigned
13		eating area. The employee may choose the assigned
14		eating area or may seat the consumer according to the
15		consumer's need for accommodation or other request;
16	(2)	The consumer's food and beverage orders are taken
17		after the consumer has been seated at the assigned
18		seating area;
19	(3)	The food and beverage orders are delivered directly to

6	<u>"Sin</u>	gle-use plastic straw" means a single-use, disposable
7	tube made	predominantly of plastic derived from either petroleum
8	<u>or a biol</u>	ogically based polymer, such as corn or other plant
9	sources,	used to transfer liquid from a container to the mouth
10	of the pe	rson drinking a beverage. "Single-use plastic straw"
11	does not	include a straw made from non-plastic materials,
12	including	but not limited to paper, pasta, wood, or bamboo."

14	SECT	ION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2100.
