

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MINIMUM WAGE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 387-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 3 "(a) Except as provided in section 387-9 and this section, 4 every employer shall pay to each employee employed by the 5 employer, wages at the rate of not less than: 6 \$6.25 per hour beginning January 1, 2003; (1) 7 (2) \$6.75 per hour beginning January 1, 2006; 8 (3) \$7.25 per hour beginning January 1, 2007; 9 (4)\$7.75 per hour beginning January 1, 2015; 10 (5) \$8.50 per hour beginning January 1, 2016; 11 (6) \$9.25 per hour beginning January 1, 2017; [and] 12 \$10.10 per hour beginning January 1, 2018 [-]; and (7)13 \$15.00 per hour beginning January 1, 2022; (8) 14 provided that beginning January 1, 2022, the State shall 15 contribute \$2.00 per hour per employee to employers with twenty-16 five or fewer employees."

- 4 SECTION 3. The department of labor and industrial
- 5 relations shall submit a report of its findings and
- 6 recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the
- 7 legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of
- the regular session of 2020. 8
- 9 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- **10** and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

11 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
