A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII PROMISE PROGRAM PLUS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the first cohort of
- 2 students from community colleges who received scholarships from
- 3 the Hawaii community college promise program are scheduled to
- 4 graduate in 2019 with associate's degrees. Some students will
- 5 be poised to enter the University of Hawaii system to obtain a
- 6 bachelor's degree, yet lack the financial resources to do so.
- 7 Extending the promise program for this cohort of students will
- 8 lead to stronger educational outcomes, an improved quality of
- 9 life for participating students, and a stronger economy for
- 10 Hawaii in general.
- 11 The legislature further finds that the research and
- 12 statistics office of the department of labor and industrial
- 13 relations publishes "Hawaii's best job opportunities", an annual
- 14 report outlining occupations that are in high demand and that
- 15 require a bachelor's degree or higher. This report also shows
- 16 the number of annual openings, growth rate, skills required, and
- 17 median annual salary for these jobs. The legislature further

1	finds that students and graduates of the Hawaii community		
2	college promise program who do not yet have a definite career		
3	goal but are pursuing further education should be strongly		
4	encouraged to pursue careers listed in the "Hawaii's best job		
5	opportunities" report, especially where personnel shortages		
6	currently exist or are projected to exist in the near future.		
7	The legislature finds that this issue is a matter of		
8	statewide concern that falls under its purview pursuant to		
9	article X, section 6, of the Hawaii State Constitution. The		
10	purpose of this Act is to:		
11	(1) Establish the University of Hawaii promise program		
12	plus to provide scholarships for the unmet direct cost		
13	needs of qualified students who are graduates of a		
14	University of Hawaii community college who received a		
15	Hawaii community college promise program scholarship		
16	and are currently enrolled at any University of Hawaii		
17	campus; and		
18	(2) Appropriate funds to establish and implement the		
19	program.		
20	SECTION 2. Chapter 304A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
21	amended by adding a new section to part IV, subpart A,		

1	subdivision 1 to be appropriately designated and to read as		
2	follows:		
3	"§304A- University of Hawaii promise program plus;		
4	established. (a) Notwithstanding section 304A-502, there is		
5	established the University of Hawaii promise program plus to be		
6	administered by the board of regents. The program shall provide		
7	scholarships for the unmet direct cost needs of qualified		
8	students who are:		
9	(1) Graduates of a University of Hawaii community college		
10	who received a Hawaii community college promise		
11	program scholarship; and		
12	(2) Enrolled at any University of Hawaii campus.		
13	(b) A qualified student enrolled in a bachelor's degree		
14	program at a University of Hawaii campus is eligible for		
15	scholarship consideration for a maximum of eight semesters if		
16	the student:		
17	(1) Qualifies for Hawaii resident tuition;		
18	(2) Completes and submits the Free Application for Federal		
19	Student Aid for each academic year, and accepts all		
20	federal and state aid, grants, scholarships, and other		
21	funding sources that do not require repayment;		

1	<u>(3)</u>	Is enrolled in the degree program with twelve or more
2		credits per semester;
3	(4)	Maintains satisfactory academic progress, as defined
4		by federal requirements established pursuant to Title
5		IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965, as amended,
6		and determined by the campus at which the student is
7		enrolled; and
8	(5)	Has been determined by the campus to have unmet direct
9		cost needs.
10	(c)	Scholarships shall be awarded:
11	(1)	On a first-come, first-served basis;
12	(2)	In an amount equal to the student's unmet direct cost
13		need based on the Free Application for Federal Student
14		Aid calculation of need minus what is available from
15		Pell grants and other funding sources specified in
16		subsection (b)(2); and
17	<u>(3)</u>	To the extent funds are available to support the
18		scholarship award;
19	provided	that students who pursue bachelor's degrees consistent
20	with the	"Hawaii's best job opportunities" report published
21	annually	by the department of labor and industrial relations

1	shall receive an increased scholarship amount, to be determined	
2	by the board of regents.	
3	(d) To continue to qualify for a scholarship under this	
4	section, a student shall:	
5	(1) Maintain a grade point average of 2.5 or higher, on a	
6	scale of 4.0 or its equivalent;	
7	(2) Earn a minimum of twenty-four credits in each academic	
8	year; and	
9	(3) Comply with any other conditions placed on the	
10	scholarship by the University of Hawaii.	
11	(e) A student who fails to comply with the requirements of	
12	this section shall be placed on scholarship probation. Social,	
13	economic, and other factors, or other extenuating circumstances	
14	as determined by the University of Hawaii, shall be considered	
15	in determining probationary status.	
16	During the probationary period, the student shall	
17	demonstrate satisfactory progress toward meeting completion of	
18	the degree and satisfying the requirements of the scholarship.	
19	Failure to meet the probationary period requirements in this	
20	section shall result in revocation of the student's scholarship,	

with the student responsible for reimbursing the University of

- 1 Hawaii for up to two semesters of scholarship amounts received
- 2 under the program. A student may be placed on scholarship
- 3 probation for no more than one semester during an eight-semester
- 4 period at a University of Hawaii campus.
- 5 (f) As used in this section, "direct cost" includes
- 6 tuition, fees, books, supplies, and transportation."
- 7 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 8 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 9 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2019-2020 and
- 10 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
- 11 year 2020-2021 to establish and implement the University of
- 12 Hawaii promise program plus, including the provision of the
- 13 program's scholarships.
- 14 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the University
- 15 of Hawaii for the purposes of this Act.
- 16 SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.
- 17 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
