A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SAFETY HELMETS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The department of health advocated in its
 Hawai'i Injury Prevention Plan for 2012-2017 for a universal
 moped and motorcycle helmet law to increase traffic safety. The
 plan cited a study that concluded that helmets reduced the risk
 of death by forty-two per cent and the risk of head injury by
 sixty-nine per cent for riders involved in an accident.

7 On June 4, 1967, Hawaii enacted a universal helmet law 8 which required all riders to wear a helmet. A review of 9 motorcycle-related fatality data found that while the Hawaii 10 universal helmet law was operative, the State experienced the 11 lowest amount of motorcycle deaths. However, the universal 12 helmet law was repealed in 1977, and after the repeal of the 13 law, fatalities rose.

Between 2007 and 2011, motorcycle deaths were the sixth leading cause of fatal unintentional injuries in Hawaii. During that same period, fifteen bicyclists died.



1 The department of transportation published and distributed the 2013-2018 Hawaii Strategic Highway Safety Plan (SHSP), with 2 its mission to "save lives and reduce injuries on Hawaii's 3 roadways through strategic partnerships and implementation of 4 5 the SHSP". The SHSP noted that between 2008-2012, only fortysix of the one hundred fifty-seven motorcycle, scooter, and 6 moped drivers that died were wearing helmets. The SHSP also 7 cited the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration's 8 findings, which state that from 2008-2012, an average of nine 9 10 additional lives per year may have been saved in Hawaii if helmets had been used. One of the strategies recommended by the 11 12 SHSP to reduce motorcycle, scooter, and moped deaths is to enact a universal helmet law to increase helmet usage. 13 The legislature finds that a universal safety helmet law 14 15 will increase traffic safety in Hawaii. 16 The purpose of this Act is to require all operators and

17 riders of motorcycles, motor scooters, mopeds, and bicycles to
18 wear protective or safety helmets.

19 SECTION 2. Section 286-81, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is20 amended to read as follows:

20	SECTION 3. Section 291C-150, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is					
21	amended to read as follows:					



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1 "[**+**]**§291C-150**[**+**] Bicycle helmets. (a) No person [under sixteen years of age] shall operate a bicycle upon a street, 2 3 bikeway, or any other public property unless that person is wearing a properly fitted and fastened bicycle helmet that has 4 5 been tested by a nationally recognized agency such as the 6 National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, the National 7 Safety Council, or the Children's Safety Network, and is 8 designed to fit the user and protect against head trauma. This 9 requirement also applies to a person who rides upon a bicycle 10 while in a restraining seat that is attached to the bicycle or who rides in a trailer towed by the bicycle. 11 12 (b) A person who provides bicycles for hire shall not rent

12 (b) A person who provides breycles for hire shall not rent 13 a bicycle to any person unless every person [who is under age 14 sixteen] is wearing a bicycle helmet, as required in subsection 15 (a), while operating the rented bicycle, occupying a restraining 16 seat that is attached to the rented bicycle, or riding in a 17 trailer towed by the rented bicycle.

18 (c) A violation of this section is punishable by a fine of
19 not more than \$25[-]; provided that:

20 (1) A person who provides bicycles for hire shall not be
 21 in violation of subsection (b) or liable for the



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amount of the fine if the person demonstrates that the 1 2 person to whom the bicycle was rented was wearing a 3 safety helmet at the time the bicycle was rented; and 4 (2) The parent or legal quardian having control or custody 5 of an unemancipated minor whose conduct violates this 6 section shall be liable for the amount of the fine 7 imposed pursuant to this section. 8 (d) Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the fines 9 collected for a violation of this section shall be paid into the 10 state treasury to the credit of the state general fund." 11 SECTION 4. Section 291C-195, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 12 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 13 "(a) No person less than fifteen years of age shall drive 14 a moped on a highway, street, roadway, or any other public 15 property in the State. No person [less than eighteen years of 16 age] shall drive a moped unless the person wears a safety helmet 17 securely fastened with a chin strap. The safety helmet shall 18 meet the specifications and requirements established by rules 19 adopted by the director."

Safety Helmets; Motorcycle; Moped; Motor Scooter; Bicycle

Description:

Requires operators and passengers of motorcycles, motor scooters, mopeds, and bicycles to wear safety helmets.

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
