BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 291C-13, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 "§291C-13 Accidents involving damage to vehicle or
- 4 property. (a) The driver of any vehicle involved in an
- 5 accident resulting only in damage to a vehicle or other property
- 6 that is driven or attended by any person shall immediately stop
- 7 [such] the vehicle at the scene of the accident or as close
- 8 thereto as possible, but shall forthwith return to, and in every
- 9 event shall remain at, the scene of the accident until the
- 10 driver has fulfilled the requirements of section 291C-14. Every
- 11 [such] applicable stop shall be made without obstructing traffic
- more than is necessary[-]; subject to subsection (b).
- 13 (b) If an accident as described in subsection (a) occurs
- 14 on a roadway nearest a berm or shoulder, the driver shall stop
- on the berm or shoulder, return to the scene of the accident,
- 16 and, if possible and safe to do so, assist other drivers
- 17 involved in the accident in moving their vehicle or other



- 1 property to the berm or shoulder as necessary; provided that
- 2 this subsection shall not apply if at least one roadway
- 3 separates the nearest berm or shoulder from the roadway that is
- 4 the scene of the accident.
- 5 (c) For any violation under this section, a surcharge of
- $6\,$ up to \$100 may be imposed, in addition to other penalties, which
- 7 shall be deposited into the trauma system special fund."
- 8 SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
 - 9 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 10 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

Motor Vehicle Accidents; Property Damage

Description:

Requires the driver of a motor vehicle involved in an accident resulting only in damage to another vehicle or property driven or attended by any person to stop the driver's vehicle on a berm or shoulder of a roadway and assist the other person in moving the other person's vehicle or other property to the berm or shoulder if the accident occurs on a roadway nearest that berm or shoulder.
