A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PROTECTION OF STREAMS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Ola i ka wai. The legislature finds that the 2 board of land and natural resources lacks rules for rendering 3 decisions on dispositions of water. The legislature recognizes 4 that public trust principles must guide these decisions and must 5 supersede commercial interests. The legislature further 6 recognizes that impacts of climate change are not sufficiently clear to allow for any disposition lasting more than fifteen 7 8 years.

9 The purpose of this Act is to:

10 (1) Prohibit the board from approving any disposition that
11 authorizes the diversion of water from streams unless
12 certain conditions are met to maintain the natural
13 resources in public trust;
14 (2) Require moneys collected through such dispositions to

be deposited into the forest stewardship fund;
provided that the department of Hawaiian home lands

3	SECTION 2. Chapter 171, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
4	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated		
5	and to read as follows:		
6	S171- Dispositions that authorize the diversion of		
7	water from streams. (a) The board shall not approve any		
8	lisposition that authorizes or has the effect of authorizing the		
9	diversion of water from streams, unless:		
10	(1) The authorization is for no more than fifteen years;		
11	(2) The board has accurate information regarding the		
12	amount of water that flows through the subject stream		
13	and the amount of water proposed to be removed from		
14	the stream;		
15	(3) The amount of consideration is at least ninety per		
16	cent of the avoided cost to the applicant of obtaining		
17	the water from an alternative source;		
18	(4) No more than fifty per cent of the water in a		
19	stream, as measured near the diversion, may be removed		
20	from the stream at any time;		



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1	(5)	The board determines that the diversion will not
2		adversely impact the ecological, cultural,
3		recreational, and aesthetic values of the stream; and
4	(6)	All other legal requirements are met.
5	<u>(b)</u>	Subsection (a) shall not apply to any authorization
6	for taro	cultivation.
7	(c)	Moneys collected through any disposition that
8	authorize	s or has the effect of authorizing the diversion of
9	water fro	om a stream shall be deposited into the forest
10	stewardsh	ip fund, section 195F-4; provided that the department
11	of Hawaii	an home lands and the office of Hawaiian affairs each
12	<u>receive</u> t	heir constitutionally-entitled share."

Water Diversion; Land Disposition; Forest Stewardship Fund; DLNR

Description:

Prohibits dispositions authorizing the diversion of water from streams unless certain conditions are met. Requires moneys collected through such dispositions to be deposited into the Forest Stewardship Fund, provided that the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands and Office of Hawaiian Affairs each receive their constitutionally-entitled share.

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
