A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AGRICULTURE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Hawaii-grown coffee
is recognized for its high quality and aromatic flavor. Hawaii grown coffee is held to a set of high quality standards, which
makes it one of the most expensive coffees in the world.
According to the National Agricultural Statistics Service of the
United States Department of Agriculture, the estimated value of
Hawaii-grown coffee in 2016 was \$48,856,000.

8 To protect the Hawaii coffee industry from counterfeiting, 9 the legislature enacted Act 328, Session Laws of Hawaii 2012, 10 which established criminal penalties for Hawaii-grown cherry, 11 parchment, and green coffee that is falsely labeled with regard 12 to the geographic origin. However, in addition to the 13 geographic origin, stricter enforcement on the labeling 14 restrictions based on the quality of the coffee being sold is critical to prevent further counterfeiting of Hawaii's 15 16 recognized high quality coffee. Furthermore, the criminal

1	penalties for false labeling should apply not only to cherry,		
2	parchment, and green coffee, but also to roasted coffee.		
3	The purpose of this Act is to extend the offense of false		
4	labeling of Hawaii-grown coffee to include violations of grade		
5	standard requirements and all stages of coffee production.		
6	SECTION 2. Section 708-871.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
7	amended to read as follows:		
8	"[[]§708-871.5[]] False labeling of Hawaii-grown coffee.		
9	(1) A person commits the offense of false labeling of Hawaii-		
10	grown coffee if the person knowingly transports, distributes,		
11	advertises, sells, or possesses with the intent to sell Hawaii-		
12	grown [green] coffee[, cherry coffee, or parchment coffee] that		
13	is falsely labeled with regard to the geographic origin of the		
14	Hawaii-grown coffee[\cdot] or the grade standard requirements of		
15	rules adopted under chapter 147.		
16	(2) For purposes of this section [+		
17	"Cherry coffee" means the unprocessed fruit of the coffee		
18	plant.		
19	"Geographic origin"], "geographic origin" means the

2		Hawaii, as designated by the State of Hawaii tax map;	
3	(b)	Hawaii is the State of Hawaii;

6	(d)	Kauai is the island of Kauai;	
7	(e)	Kona is the north Kona and south Kona districts on the

18	(3)	False labeling of Hawaii-grown coffee is a class C	
19	felony."		



SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
begun before its effective date.
SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect July 31, 2051.
