A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that there is a public 2 benefit from substantial investment in high-quality,
- 3 developmentally-appropriate early learning programs. These
- 4 investments have been driven by significant and continuing
- 5 research affirming the positive effects of high-quality early
- 6 learning programs on the physical, cognitive, linguistic,
- 7 social, emotional, and economic outcomes of young children.
- 8 Provided with such opportunities, children are more likely to
- 9 succeed in kindergarten and beyond as well as grow into healthy,
- 10 capable, and contributing adults.
- 11 Longitudinal studies have also proven that high-quality
- 12 early learning programs are especially effective for high-risk
- 13 children, including low-income and otherwise disadvantaged
- 14 children, with great potential to alter their lifetime
- 15 trajectories. Well-executed and well-targeted early learning
- 16 programs have immediate and long-term benefits not only for the
- 17 children participating in the programs but also for the

- 1 societies in which they live, which boast higher levels of
- 2 educational attainment; reduced homelessness, crime, and
- 3 substance abuse; improved health; and better overall social and
- 4 economic well-being.
- 5 The legislature further finds that although the department
- 6 of education administers programs of education and public
- 7 instruction throughout the State, including special education
- 8 and Title I funded programs at the prekindergarten level, the
- 9 executive office on early learning, under policies established
- 10 by the early learning board, should be responsible for the
- 11 administration of programs related to state-funded
- 12 prekindergarten.
- 13 The purpose of this Act is to authorize the executive
- 14 office on early learning to serve as the overseer of state-
- 15 funded early learning programs, except for special education and
- 16 Title I funded programs.
- 17 SECTION 2. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 18 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 19 and to read as follows:
- 20 "§302A- Public prekindergarten classes; annual report to
- 21 the legislature. The department shall submit to the legislature

- 1 an annual report regarding the number of public prekindergarten
- 2 classes that it operates."
- 3 SECTION 3. Chapter 302D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 4 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 5 and to read as follows:
- 6 "§302D- Public prekindergarten classes; annual report to
- 7 the legislature. Every authorizer shall submit to the
- 8 legislature an annual report regarding the number of
- 9 prekindergarten classes under its chartering authority."
- 10 SECTION 4. Chapter 302L, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 11 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 12 and to read as follows:
- 13 "§302L- Public prekindergarten classes; annual report to
- 14 the legislature. The office shall submit to the legislature an
- 15 annual report regarding the number of public prekindergarten
- 16 classes that it administers."
- 17 SECTION 5. Section 26-12, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 18 amended to read as follows:
- 19 "§26-12 Department of education. The department of
- 20 education shall be headed by an executive board to be known as
- 21 the board of education.

- 1 Under policies established by the board, the superintendent
- 2 shall administer programs of education and public instruction
- 3 throughout the State, including education at the primary and
- 4 secondary school levels, adult education, school library
- 5 services, health education and instruction (not including dental
- 6 health treatment transferred to the department of health),
- 7 special education and Title I funded programs at the
- 8 prekindergarten level, and such other programs as may be
- 9 established by law. Under policies established by the early
- 10 learning board, the executive office on early learning shall
- 11 have oversight, as defined and determined by the early learning
- 12 board, of all state-funded prekindergarten programs, except for
- 13 special education and Title I funded programs. The state
- 14 librarian, under policies established by the board of education,
- 15 shall be responsible for the administration of programs relating
- 16 to public library services and transcribing services for the
- 17 blind.
- 18 The functions and authority heretofore exercised by the
- 19 department of education (except dental health treatment
- 20 transferred to the department of health), library of Hawaii,
- 21 Hawaii county library, Maui county library, and the transcribing

- 1 services program of the bureau of sight conservation and work
- 2 with the blind, as heretofore constituted are transferred to the
- 3 public library system established by this chapter.
- 4 The management contract between the board of supervisors of
- 5 the county of Kauai and the Kauai public library association
- 6 shall be terminated at the earliest time after November 25,
- 7 1959, permissible under the terms of the contract and the
- 8 provisions of this paragraph shall constitute notice of
- 9 termination, and the functions and authority heretofore
- 10 exercised by the Kauai county library as heretofore constituted
- 11 and the Kauai public library association over the public
- 12 libraries in the county of Kauai shall thereupon be transferred
- 13 to the public library system established by this chapter.
- 14 The management contracts between the trustees of the
- 15 library of Hawaii and the Friends of the Library of Hawaii, and
- 16 between the library of Hawaii and the Hilo library and reading
- 17 room association, shall be terminated at the earliest time after
- 18 November 25, 1959, permissible under the terms of the contracts,
- 19 and the provisions of this paragraph shall constitute notice of
- 20 termination.

1	Upon the termination of the contracts, the State or the
2	counties shall not enter into any library management contracts
3	with any private association; provided that in providing library
4	services, the board of education may enter into contracts
5	approved by the governor for the use of lands, buildings,
6	equipment, and facilities owned by any private association.
7	Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the board of
8	education may establish, specify the membership number and
9	quorum requirements for, appoint members to, and disestablish a
10	commission in each county to be known as the library advisory
11	commission, which shall in each case sit in an advisory capacity
12	to the board of education on matters relating to public library
13	services in their respective county."
14	SECTION 6. Section 302A-1111, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
15	amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
16	"(a) Under policies established by the board, the
17	superintendent shall be designated as the chief executive
18	officer of the public school system having jurisdiction over the
19	internal organization, operation, and management of the public
20	school system, as provided by law; and shall administer programs
21	of education and public instruction throughout the State,

- 1 including education at the primary and secondary school levels,
- 2 and such other programs as may be established by law[-];
- 3 provided that all state-funded prekindergarten programs, other
- 4 than special education and Title I funded programs, shall be
- 5 under the oversight, as defined and determined by the early
- 6 learning board, of the executive office on early learning."
- 7 SECTION 7. Section 302A-1128, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 8 amended to read as follows:
- 9 "§302A-1128 Department powers and duties. The department
- 10 shall have entire charge and control and be responsible for the
- 11 conduct of all affairs pertaining to public instruction in the
- 12 public schools the department establishes and operates,
- 13 including operating and maintaining the capital improvement and
- 14 repair and maintenance programs for department and school
- 15 facilities. The department may establish and maintain schools
- 16 for secular instruction at such places and for such terms as in
- 17 its discretion it may deem advisable and the funds at its
- 18 disposal may permit. The schools may include high schools,
- 19 kindergarten schools, [schools or classes for early childhood
- 20 education, boarding schools, Hawaiian language medium education
- 21 schools, and evening and day schools. The department may also

- 1 maintain classes for technical and other instruction in any
- 2 school where there may not be pupils sufficient in number to
- 3 justify the establishment of separate schools for these
- 4 purposes."
- 5 SECTION 8. There is appropriated out of the general
- 6 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
- 7 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2019-2020 and the
- 8 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
- 9 2020-2021 for early childhood education programs administered by
- 10 the executive office on early learning.
- 11 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the executive
- 12 office on early learning for the purposes of this Act.
- 13 SECTION 9. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 14 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 15 SECTION 10. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
