

HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO AMEND ITS ADMINISTRATIVE RULES TO ALLOW FOR COMMERCIAL SALE OF RABBIT MEAT FOR CONSUMPTION.

WHEREAS, only fifteen percent of Hawaii's food supply is 1 grown locally, and the Hawaii 2050 Sustainability Plan 2 identifies the goal of doubling local food production by 2030; 3 4 and 5 WHEREAS, due to Hawaii's remote location and reliance on 6 imported food, Hawaii's food security is particularly vulnerable 7 to natural disasters and disruptions of the shipping and food 8 9 supply; and 10 WHEREAS, by replacing only ten percent of the food Hawaii 11 currently imports, an estimated \$313,000,000 dollars would 12 remain in the State; and 13 14 15 WHEREAS, in many countries and regions around the world, rabbit meat is a widely consumed, commercially-available protein 16 source; and 17 18 WHEREAS, rabbits have a high rate of reproduction, early 19 maturity, rapid growth rate, high genetic selection potential, 20 21 efficient feed and land space utilization, and high-quality 22 nutritious meat; and 23 WHEREAS, rabbit meat is lower in fat, cholesterol, and 24 25 calories than beef, chicken, lamb, pork, and turkey with comparable protein levels; and 26 27 WHEREAS, developing a rabbit meat industry in Hawaii may 28 29 contribute positively to Hawaii's sustainability goals, allow for increased food self-sufficiency, and support economic 30

development and more diverse product lines for Hawaii ranchers; 1 and 2 3 4 WHEREAS, demand for rabbit meat in the United States is 5 gradually increasing due to increasing demand from restaurants and consumers interested in sustainable and exotic meats; and 6 7 8 WHEREAS, producers on the island of Hawaii are successfully cultivating rabbits for subsistence consumption, but lack a 9 regulatory framework that would allow for the commercial sale of 10 11 the rabbit meat; and 12 WHEREAS, according to title 9 Code of Federal Regulations 13 part 354 entitled "Voluntary Inspection of Rabbits and Edible 14 Products Thereof," the United States Department of Agriculture 15 (USDA) does not mandate the federal Food Safety and Inspection 16 17 Service (FSIS) to inspect the slaughter of rabbits, and the inspection is voluntary and subject to fees and charges by the 18 FSIS; and 19 20 21 WHEREAS, the Department of Health, pursuant to section 11-22 50-31, Hawaii Administrative Rules (HAR), allows for the sale of 23 game animals, including mammals such as rabbits, that are commercially raised for food; provided they are raised, 24 25 slaughtered, and processed under a voluntary inspection program conducted by the agency that has health jurisdiction, or a 26 routine inspection program conducted by an agency other than the 27 agency with animal health jurisdiction; and 28 29 30 WHEREAS, there is currently no USDA voluntary inspection program in the State of Hawaii, and there is no comparable state 31 voluntary inspection program for the inspection of rabbit meat 32 33 for commercial sale; and 34 35 WHEREAS, Hawaii has no routine inspection program for game 36 animals allowing rabbit meat producers to commercially sell their product as an approved food source under the Department of 37 Health's administrative rules; and 38 39 40 WHEREAS, establishing a state voluntary inspection program that would meet the federal requirements is costly and would 41 require additional state funds, personnel, and facilities; and 42

1 2 WHEREAS, establishing a routine inspection program for game animals under state agencies may also be cost-prohibitive; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, the Department of Health has previously amended section 11-50-31, HAR, to allow for the commercial sale of 6 field-dressed wild game animals; provided the animals receive a 7 postmortem examination by an approved veterinarian or 8 veterinarian's designee; and 9 10 11 WHEREAS, the lack of a clear and specific process for the inspection of rabbits commercially raised for food is a 12 deterrent for producers to cultivate rabbits for intrastate 13 commerce; now, therefore, 14 15 16 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Thirtieth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 17 2020, the Senate concurring, that the Department of Health is 18 19 urged to amend its administrative rules to allow for the commercial sale of rabbit meat for consumption; and 20 21 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Health 22 consider adopting a rule similar to section 11-50-31, HAR, that 23 24 would allow for the commercial sale of rabbit meat for consumption; provided that the rabbit herd receives inspections 25 by a veterinarian who holds a valid license to practice in the 26 27 State of Hawaii; and 28 29 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Department of Health is 30 encouraged to consider including other game animals, as defined in section 11-50-2, HAR, in its amended rules; and 31 32 33 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Director of Health 34 and Chairperson of the Board of Agriculture. 35 36 37 OFFERED BY: Jan Cames 38
