## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE ATTORNEY GENERAL TO CONVENE A TASK FORCE TO STUDY THE REPORTING, PROSECUTION, AND CONVICTION RATE OF HATE CRIMES IN THE STATE.

WHEREAS, hate crimes are defined as any criminal act in
which the perpetrator intentionally selected a victim because of
hostility toward the actual or perceived race, religion,
disability, ethnicity, national origin, gender identity or
expression, or sexual orientation of any person; and

7 WHEREAS, the Department of the Attorney General is responsible for the collection, storage, dissemination, and 8 analysis of all hate crime data from all agencies that have 9 primary investigative, action, or program responsibility for 10 11 adult or juvenile offenses, including the county police 12 departments, the county prosecutors, the family courts, and the departments or agencies responsible for administering any 13 correctional facilities; and 14

16 WHEREAS, the Department of the Attorney General currently 17 only includes data based on convictions in its annual report of 18 hate crime data submitted to the Governor, Judiciary, Department 19 of Public Safety, and Legislature; and

21 WHEREAS, based on this rendering of statistics, only two 22 hate crimes were reported for the State in the most recent 23 annual report; and

25 WHEREAS, hate crime data acquired by the county police 26 departments indicates that the number of crimes initially 27 flagged as hate crimes greatly exceeds the number reported by 28 the Attorney General; and

30 WHEREAS, there appears to be a disconnect between the 31 number of crimes initially reported as hate crimes and those

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that are eventually included in the Attorney General's report; 1 2 now, therefore, 3 4 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 5 Thirtieth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2020, the Senate concurring, that the Attorney General is 6 requested to convene a task force to study the progression of 7 8 hate crime investigations and prosecutions from the initial police report to the closing of the case; and 9 10 11 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force is requested to make recommendations on improvements to be made in the 12 prosecution and comprehensive reporting of hate crimes; and 13 14 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force membership is 15 16 requested to include a representative of the Department of the Attorney General, a representative of each county police 17 department, a representative of each county office of the 18 prosecuting attorney, and four representatives from agencies 19 that have investigative, detention, custodial, adjudicative, or 20 program responsibility for adult or juvenile offenses; and 21 22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force is requested to 23 24 submit a report of its findings and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later than forty 25 days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2021; and 26 27 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 28 29 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, Attorney General, Prosecuting Attorney of each county, and Chief of 30 Police of each county. 31 32 33 34 101 OFFERED BY:

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
