HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH'S DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES DIVISION TO MAINTAIN THE INTEGRITY OF CHAPTER 333F, HAWAII REVISED STATUTES, TO SERVE INDIVIDUALS WITH DEVELOPMENTAL OR INTELLECTUAL DISABILITIES REGARDLESS OF WHETHER THEY HAVE SIGNIFICANT MEDICAL AND BEHAVIORAL NEEDS OR A DUAL DIAGNOSIS OF A DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITY AND MENTAL ILLNESS.

1 WHEREAS, individuals with developmental disabilities and 2 their families are more often than not frustrated by the current 3 system of care and its philosophical underpinnings that seem to 4 favor provider agencies and a constantly changing, bureaucratic 5 approach to service delivery that puts the interests of rules 6 and regulations ahead of the interests of individuals; and

WHEREAS, instead, individuals would like to see a person-8 centered service system that provides continuity and stability 9 10 of services and supports characterized by a comprehensive understanding of individuals' strengths, desires, hopes, and 11 aspirations and provided in a manner that reflects a sincere 12 commitment to maximizing opportunities for individuals to 13 function with as much independence and self-determination as 14 possible; and 15

WHEREAS, once an adult with a developmental disability is determined to be eligible for services under the Department of Health's Developmental Disabilities Division, it is not necessary to reevaluate their eligibility again; and

22 WHEREAS, for individuals with developmental disabilities, 23 their eligibility for services under the Developmental 24 Disabilities Division is not contingent upon their eligibility 25 for Medicaid or Medicaid-funded services; and 26

WHEREAS, for individuals who are eligible for services
under the Developmental Disabilities Division for their
developmental disability condition, they will maintain their



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1 eligibility regardless of whether they have significant medical 2 and behavioral needs or have a dual diagnosis of a developmental disability and mental illness; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, people with developmental disabilities will be actively involved in policy discussions and decisions and will 6 be respected as partners in the process, making informed choices 7 8 and decisions in order to support productive and fulfilling 9 lives; and 10 WHEREAS, families and guardians will be listened to and 11 respected, and the Developmental Disabilities Division will 12 13 strive to earn and keep their trust along with the trust of the 14 public; and 15 WHEREAS, home and community-based options will promote the 16 availability and usage of self-directed services; and 17 18 WHEREAS, public resources will be used effectively and 19 efficiently to help those served achieve their goals; and 20 21 WHEREAS, the integration of habilitation, social, and 22 23 clinical supports will be considered paramount when enhancing and developing services throughout the delivery system; now, 24 therefore, 25 26 27 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Thirtieth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 28 29 2020, the Senate concurring, that the Department of Health's Developmental Disabilities Division is requested to maintain the 30 31 integrity of chapter 333F, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to serve individuals with developmental or intellectual disabilities 32 33 regardless of whether they have significant medical and 34 behavioral needs or a dual diagnosis of a developmental disability and mental illness; and 35 36 37 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Developmental Disabilities Division is requested to: 38 39 Review the existing state statutory definition of 40 (1)"developmental disabilities" in comparison to other 41

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states and study the impacts of changing the 1 definition of "developmental disabilities"; 2 3 Discuss general eligibility issues relating to the (2)4 5 current statutory definition of "developmental disabilities"; 6 7 Identify gap groups that are currently ineligible for 8 (3) developmental disabilities services but are part of 9 the intellectual and developmental disabilities 10 population; and 11 12 (4) Determine strategies to meet the increasing needs of 13 the intellectual and developmental or physical 14 disabilities population, including but not limited to 15 identifying and engaging agencies that can address 16 such needs with a focus on identifying and attempting 17 to provide appropriate safety net processes or 18 services to as large a segment as feasible of the 19 identified gap groups; and 20 21 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Developmental Disabilities 22 Division is requested to submit a report of its findings and 23 recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the 24 Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of 25 the Regular Session of 2021; and 26 27 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 28 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, Attorney 29 General, Director of Health, Director of Human Services, 30 Executive Director of the Hawaii State Council on Developmental 31 Disabilities, Executive Director of the Hawaii Disability Rights 32

33 Center, Acting Director of the University of Hawaii Center on
34 Disability Studies, and Executive Director of the National
35 Association of State Directors of Developmental Disabilities.
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
