HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF BUSINESS, ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, AND TOURISM, IN COOPERATION WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE AND THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND CONSUMER AFFAIRS, TO CONDUCT A STUDY ON AGRICULTURAL COOPERATIVES.

WHEREAS, while there is no universally accepted definition, 1 2 a cooperative can be defined as a business entity established 3 pursuant to state law that is owned and operated for the benefit of any individual who utilizes the cooperative's services; and 4 5 WHEREAS, according to the National Agricultural Law Center, 6 an agricultural cooperative, sometimes referred to as a farmer 7 cooperative, is often formed to bolster the collective economic 8 9 market power of a group of farmers; and 10 11 WHEREAS, an agricultural cooperative can serve various functions, including providing loans to farmers, supplying 12 information regarding agricultural production, bargaining on 13 14 behalf of its members, or marketing agricultural products for its members; and 15 16 WHEREAS, generally, an agricultural cooperative is: 17 18 (1) Owned and democratically controlled by the entities 19 that use the cooperative's services; 20 21 22 (2) Limited with respect to the returns that its members receive on their individual financial investments into 23 the cooperative; 24 25 Financed primarily by cooperative members and entities (3) 26 that utilize the services of the cooperative; and 27

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1 (4) Equitable in the distribution of any net profits to 2 its members, generally distributing profits in 3 proportion to each member's use of the cooperative; 4 and 5 WHEREAS, traditionally, agricultural cooperatives are 6 7 organized to support three main objectives: supply; marketing; 8 or service; and 9 10 WHEREAS, a supply agricultural cooperative provides to its members inputs necessary for agricultural production, such as 11 12 fertilizers or pesticides; and 13 14 WHEREAS, a marketing agricultural cooperative provides to 15 its members marketing assistance for their agricultural products; and 16 17 18 WHEREAS, a service agricultural cooperative provides to its 19 members services related to their agricultural endeavors, such as housing, transportation, or insurance; and 20 21 22 WHEREAS, value-added agricultural cooperatives are a newer type of agricultural cooperative that is growing in popularity 23 24 and holds promise in Hawaii due to the State's value-added manufacturing sector; and 25 26 27 WHEREAS, value-added agricultural cooperatives assist with the conversion of raw agricultural products into further 28 processed products, and value-added agriculture is a rapidly 29 30 expanding area of Hawaii's economy; and 31 32 WHEREAS, agricultural cooperatives can be affected by state 33 and federal regulations that do not necessarily apply to regular business corporations; and 34 35 WHEREAS, given the scarcity of resources and high business 36 37 costs faced by entities engaged in agricultural endeavors in the State, farmers in Hawaii may benefit from adopting a cooperative 38 model of farming and farm ownership that will offer mutual 39 support as well as cost- and resource-sharing; now, therefore, 40

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1 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Thirtieth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2 2020, the Senate concurring, that the Department of Business, 3 Economic Development, and Tourism is requested to conduct a 4 study of agricultural cooperatives in cooperation with the 5 Department of Agriculture and the Department of Commerce and 6 7 Consumer Affairs; and 8

9 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this agricultural cooperative 10 study include an examination of:

- The structure of agricultural cooperatives in other (1)states, including any regulations regarding formation, financing, and governance;
 - (2) Any efforts by state governments to regulate or support agricultural cooperatives; and
 - (3) Any benefits that State regulation or support of agricultural cooperatives may bring to Hawaii's farmers, industries, and economy; and

23 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Business, 24 Economic Development, and Tourism is requested to submit a report to the Legislature of its findings and recommendations, 25 26 including any proposed legislation, no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2021; and 27 28

29 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Director of 30 Business, Economic Development, and Tourism; Chairperson of the 31 32 Board of Agriculture; and Director of Commerce and Consumer Affairs. 33 34

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
