HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE PEOPLE OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA TO PARTICIPATE IN ELECTIONS AND PREVENT THE EROSION OF THE DEMOCRATIC PROCESS ON WHICH THE REPUBLIC WAS BUILT.

1 WHEREAS, the United States of America was conceived in 2 liberty and established as a government that derived its powers 3 from the consent of the governed; and 4 5 WHEREAS, the United States of America was the first modern 6 republic granting its citizens the power of self-determination 7 through democratic elections; and 8 9 WHEREAS, throughout its long history, this nation has grown 10 by empowering and expanding fundamental voting rights to all its citizens, regardless of race, gender, or social or economic 11 status; and 12 13 14 WHEREAS, in 1964, seventy-seven percent of Americans had trust in their government and over sixty-four percent of 15 16 Americans who were eligible to vote, voted in the presidential 17 election to choose government leaders and priorities; and 18 19 WHEREAS, in 2019, trust in government has fallen to seventeen percent and just fifty-five percent of Americans voted 20 in the 2016 presidential election; and 21 22 23 WHEREAS, the rapidly increasing influence of money in politics has led to elections frequently being won on the basis 24 25 of the amount of dollars spent on advertising, rather than the merits of the candidates or issues being debated; and 26 27 28 WHEREAS, the growing pressure of special interests and 29 their lobbying influence at the Congress of the United States of

America frequently decides issues against public opinion and the 1 2 will of the people; and 3 4 WHEREAS, the increasing prevalence of disinformation 5 campaigns and fake news spread by foreign nations and domestic 6 entities have begun to influence the outcome of democratic 7 elections; and 8 9 WHEREAS, efforts to limit the ease and ability of citizens 10 to vote has restricted participation and disenfranchised countless voters in many states; and 11 12 13 WHEREAS, politicians frequently seek to capitalize on the public's growing cynicism, rather than strive to restore faith 14 15 in government and the rule of law; and 16 17 WHEREAS, deepening partisan divide and political polarization increasingly decides issues based on political 18 19 gain, rather than public interest, which forestalls a productive exchange of ideas within civil society; and 20 21 22 WHEREAS, these growing challenges have threatened and 23 diminished the ability of citizens to participate in the 24 democratic process and meaningfully self-govern, leading to an 25 erosion of democracy; and 26 27 WHEREAS, each year, the Economist Intelligence Unit 28 releases a "Democracy Index" which categorizes each county in 29 the world as a "full democracy" in which basic political 30 freedoms and civil liberties are respected; "flawed democracy" 31 in which free and fair elections occur with some issues and 32 there is a respect for basic civil liberties, but there are 33 governance problems and low levels of political participation; 34 "hybrid regimes" which have regular election fraud, issues such 35 as harassment of the media and government corruption, and more 36 pronounced faults than flawed democracies; and "authoritarian 37 regimes" which have no democracy or where the conventional institutions of democracy have no meaningful significance; and 38 39 40 WHEREAS, in 2016, the "Democracy Index" from the Economist Intelligence Unit downgraded the ranking of the United States 41 42 government from a "full democracy" to a "flawed democracy", in

part due to the extremely low levels of popular trust in 1 2 government, elected representatives, and political parties; and 3 4 WHEREAS, since the downgrading, the ranking of the United 5 States government as a democracy has continued to drop; and 6 7 WHEREAS, the United States of America was recently rated 8 twenty-fifth in the world by the "Democracy Index"; and 9 10 WHEREAS, the dangerous disenfranchisement of American 11 citizens and erosion of democracy threatens the very fabric of 12 this nation and the democratic principles on which it was built; 13 now, therefore, 14 15 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Thirtieth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 16 2020, the Senate concurring, that the people of the United 17 States are urged to participate in elections and prevent erosion 18 19 of the democratic process; and 20 21 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that every citizen is urged to 22 educate themselves on the issues most important to them, 23 register to vote, and participate in the democratic process; and 24 25 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that every measure should be taken by the federal government, every state, and most of all by every 26 citizen, to ensure that this nation shall have a new birth of 27 28 freedom and that government of the people, by the people, and 29 for the people, shall not perish from the earth; and 30 31 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 32 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the President of the United States, Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the United 33 34 States, Speaker of the United States House of Representatives, 35 President Pro Tempore of the United States Senate, Hawaii's 36 congressional delegation, and the Governor of each state of the 37 United States.
