HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE HAWAII TOURISM AUTHORITY TO HELP ADDRESS THE IMPACTS OF INCREASED TOURISM ON LOCAL COMMUNITIES.

1 2	WHEREAS, tourism has long been a pillar of Hawaii's modern economy; and
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4 5	WHEREAS, the tourism industry employs numerous residents
	and positively benefits the State's economy in various ways; and
6	
7	WHEREAS, the annual number of visitors to Hawaii has more
8	than doubled from 4,800,000 in 1985, to 10,000,000 in 2019; and
9	
10	WHEREAS, residents of Hawaii are increasingly experiencing
11	the impact of increased tourism on the quality of daily life;
12	and
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14	WHEREAS, tourist demand for non-hotel and non-resort
15	lodging has contributed to increasing rent and other high costs
16	of housing for local residents in numerous areas; and
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18	WHEREAS, the increased number of visitors on Hawaii's roads
19	has increased traffic congestion, decreased available parking,
20	and exacerbated deterioration of roadways and infrastructure;

23	WHEREAS, the increased number of visitors has also strained
24	natural resources; crowded public beaches, trails, and public
25	spaces; and increased the cost of properly maintaining public
26	infrastructure and natural resources; and
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28	WHEREAS, on average, each visitor to Hawaii is spending
29	less in Hawaii than in previous years; and

1 WHEREAS, additional moneys spent by tourists could be used 2 to pay for public services, infrastructure, and other needs for which local taxpayers are currently forced to pay; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, recent surveys and polls show that the general public's attitudes towards tourism are growing increasingly 6 7 negative; and 8 9 WHEREAS, more should be done to address the impacts of 10 tourism on local communities and better balance the benefits of 11 tourism and the needs of local residents; and 12 13 WHEREAS, the mission of the Hawaii Tourism Authority is to manage the strategic growth of Hawaii's visitor industry in a 14 manner consistent with the economic goals, cultural values, 15 16 natural resource preservation efforts, and community interests of the residents of Hawaii; now, therefore, 17 18 19 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Thirtieth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 20 2020, the Senate concurring, that the Hawaii Tourism Authority 21 22 is requested to help address the impacts of increased tourism on local communities; and 23 24 25 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Hawaii Tourism Authority is encouraged to collaborate with relevant stakeholders and 26 communicate with affected communities to identify issues and 27 areas of concern and develop recommendations to address these 28 29 issues and areas of concern; and 30 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Hawaii Tourism Authority is 31 requested to report its findings and recommendations, including 32 33 any proposed legislation, to the Legislature not less than 34 twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2022; and 35 36 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that until plans have been developed 37 to address tourism-related impacts on local communities, the 38 39 Hawaii Tourism Authority is requested to focus its efforts on increasing the amount of money spent by visitors to Hawaii 40 instead of increasing the number of visitors to Hawaii beyond 41 10,000,000 per year; and 42
