HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE FEDERAL AVIATION ADMINISTRATION TO TAKE ACTION REGARDING COMMERCIAL HELICOPTER TOUR OPERATIONS IN HAWAII.

1 2 3 4	WHEREAS, commercial helicopter tours are a popular visitor activity in Hawaii that have been successful for some private companies; and
5 6 7 8 9	WHEREAS, commercial helicopter tours have however become a bane to many residents of areas over which the tours fly, as the lack of regulation and the lucrative nature of the tours have created a "wild west" in the sky; and
10 11 12 13 14 15	WHEREAS, commercial helicopter tours focusing on the natural scenery of the coastlines, mountains, and national parks fly over the same areas and neighborhoods on a daily basis, to the detriment of residents and visitors below, who experience constant helicopter noise; and
16 17 18 19	WHEREAS, due to the distress and disruption caused by chronic helicopter noise, the noise has become a public health concern; and
20 21 22	WHEREAS, comprehensive regulation of these helicopters and the enforcement of those regulations are necessary; and
23 24 25 26	WHEREAS, although helicopters are required to maintain a minimum flight altitude of one thousand five hundred feet, it appears that many tour companies ignore this requirement; and
27 28 29 30 31	WHEREAS, it would be appropriate to increase the minimum flight altitude to two thousand five hundred feet when flying above residences, and to five thousand feet when flying above national park land; and

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WHEREAS, tour helicopters should be required to avoid 1 residences and use offshore routes whenever possible; and 2 3 WHEREAS, air tour management plans for national parks 4 5 should be created, pursuant to the National Parks Air Tour Management Act of 2000; and 6 7 WHEREAS, it would be appropriate to impose tiered penalties 8 on and revoke flying privileges from repeat violators of 9 aircraft regulations; and 10 11 WHEREAS, flight pattern regulations, elevation regulations, 12 and air tour management plans for national parks are under the 13 jurisdiction of the Federal Aviation Administration; now, 14 therefore, 15 16 17 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Thirtieth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 18 2020, the Senate concurring, that the Federal Aviation 19 Administration is urged to more aggressively enforce existing 20 laws against commercial tour operators in the State; and 21 22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Federal Aviation 23 Administration is urged to increase minimum flight altitudes for 24 tour helicopters, mandate offshore tour aircraft routes when 25 appropriate, and create air tour management plans for national 26 27 parks in Hawaii; and 28 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 29 30 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Administrator of the Federal Aviation Administration, Director of the Hawaii 31 Department of Transportation, and members of Hawaii's 32 congressional delegation. 33 34 35 36 OFFERED BY: HCR LRB 20-0001.doc 2

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
