HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE GOVERNOR TO PROVIDE AN ADDRESS ON THE STATE OF THE NATIVE HAWAIIAN PEOPLE.

WHEREAS, the State of Hawaii has a constitutional and 1 fiduciary responsibility to nurture, uplift and house native 2 3 Hawaiians; and 4 WHEREAS, the Hawaiian Homes Commission Act of 1920 requires 5 the legislature to make sufficient sums available for: (1) the 6 development of home, agriculture, farm and ranch lots; (2) home, 7 agriculture, aguaculture, farm and ranch loans; and(3) 8 rehabilitation projects including, but not limited to, 9 educational, economic, political, social and cultural processes 10 by which the general welfare and conditions of native Hawaiians 11 are thereby improved; and 12 13 WHEREAS, one hundred years after the Hawaiian Homes 14 Commission Act there are over 28,000 eligible native Hawaiians 15 waiting to receive land; and 16 17 WHEREAS, the cost of living in the state of Hawai'i is 18 among the highest in the United States; and 19 20 WHEREAS, native Hawaiian families living in Hawai'i have 21 the lowest median family income of all major ethnic groups in 22 the state; and 23 24 WHEREAS, among all major ethnic groups in Hawai`i, native 25 Hawaiians in the public-school system have the lowest graduation 26 rate, score disproportionately lower than non-Hawaiians on 27 standardized tests, and test results continue to show a lack of 28 proficiency in both Mathematics and English Language 29 Arts/Literacy; and 30 31

WHEREAS, native Hawaiians have the shortest life expectancy 1 2 and exhibit higher mortality rates than the total population due to heart disease, cancer, stroke, and diabetes; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, almost 30 percent of the homeless population is 6 comprised of native Hawaiians; and 7 WHEREAS, native Hawaiians have the highest poverty rates 8 for individuals and families, with 12.6 percent of families and 9 45,420 individuals (15.5 percent of the population) living below 10 the poverty level; and 11 12 13 WHEREAS, only 38.6 percent of registered voters turned out to vote, with native Hawaiians being the least represented 14 demographic in that percentage; and 15 16 WHEREAS, over 40 percent of people incarcerated under 17 Hawai'i jurisdiction in 2018 were reported as being native 18 19 Hawaiian; and 20 WHEREAS, these critical indicators suggest that the needs 21 of the native Hawaiian community have not been met; and 22 23 WHEREAS, due to the severe lack of prosperity within the 24 native Hawaiian community and the high cost of living, 25 especially regarding housing prices, native Hawaiians are 26 migrating to the mainland at a pace faster than other ethnic 27 groups residing in the Hawaiian Islands; and 28 29 30 WHEREAS, If the native Hawaiian community continues to migrate to the mainland in search of prosperity at the current 31 pace, Hawaii's cultural identity could be lost; now, therefore, 32 33 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 34 Thirtieth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 35 2020, the Senate concurring, requests that the Governor give an 36 "Annual Report on the State of the Native Hawaiian People"; and 37 38 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the "Annual Report on the State 39 of the Native Hawaiian People" be given following the State of 40 41 the State and State of the Judiciary addresses; and 42

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Annual Report on the State of the Native Hawaiian People shall include, but not be limited to statistics and reports regarding average income, health, education, homelessness, voter participation, incarceration levels, home ownership, the number of native Hawaiians who have received land through the Department of Hawaiian Homelands, the number of native Hawaiians still waiting for land; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 9 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, 10 Chairperson of the Hawaiian Homes Commission, Chairperson of the 11 Board of Trustees of the Office of Hawaiian Affairs, Chair of 12 the Senate Standing Committee on Hawaiian Affairs; Chair of the 13 14 House of Representatives Standing Committee on Water, Land, and Hawaiian Affairs, Chief Executive Officer of the Council for 15 Native Hawaiian Advancement. 16 17
