HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE GOVERNOR TO CONVENE A BLUE RIBBON RECONCILIATION COMMISSION TO EXAMINE AND FORMULATE A RECONCILIATION PROCESS RELATING TO ISSUES OF PAST, PRESENT, AND FUTURE IMPORTANCE TO THE NATIVE HAWAIIAN PEOPLE, THE STATE OF HAWAII, AND THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA.

WHEREAS, before January 17, 1893, the United States of 1 2 America had a political, economic, cultural, and diplomatic 3 relationship with the Kingdom of Hawaii; and 4 5 WHEREAS, on January 17, 1893, this relationship was shattered by the actions of agents and citizens of the United 6 7 States of America; and 8 9 WHEREAS, the State of Hawaii recognized the consequences of these actions and therefore significantly amended the Hawaii 10 11 State Constitution in 1978, and the Legislature also enacted unprecedented legislation to address these consequences; and 12 13 14 WHEREAS, in 1993, the 103rd Congress enacted Public Law 103-150 to, in part, apologize officially for both the overthrow 15 of the Kingdom of Hawaii and the concomitant deprivation of the 16 rights of Native Hawaiians to self-determination; and 17 18 19 WHEREAS, after this apology, efforts to effectuate the apology and to establish a new relationship of respect and trust 20

20 apology and to establish a new relationship of respect and trust 21 with the Native Hawaiian people have met with varying levels of 22 success; and 23

24 WHEREAS, there remains a pressing need to establish a new
25 relationship based on reconciliation and trust between the
26 Native Hawaiian people, the State of Hawaii, and the United

1 WHEREAS, establishing and engaging in a process for reconciliation will provide a strong foundation for this 2 relationship; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, establishing and engaging in a participatory and meaningful process for reconciliation will ensure that issues of 6 importance to the Native Hawaiian people, the State of Hawaii, 7 8 and the United States of America are addressed; and 9 10 WHEREAS, a process for reconciliation that focuses on a shared commitment to a positive future for all the people of 11 12 Hawaii will enable the people of Hawaii to move respectfully into the future; and 13 14 15 WHEREAS, a process for reconciliation will provide a participatory and meaningful process of engagement to address 16 the current discord related to Mauna Kea, including issues 17 18 related to land use and stewardship, the environment, economy, culture, and science; now, therefore, 19 20 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 21 Thirtieth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 22 23 2020, the Senate concurring, that the Governor is requested to convene a Blue Ribbon Reconciliation Commission to: 24 25 26 (1) Examine and establish a reconciliation process 27 relating to past, present, and future issues of importance to the Native Hawaiian people, the State of 28 29 Hawaii, and the United States of America; and 30 Identify processes and reconciliation proposals 31 (2) related to land use and stewardship, the environment, 32 economy, culture, and science; and 33 34 35 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislature requests the Blue Ribbon Reconciliation Commission to make recommendations 36 37 that ·
