

HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES TO CONDUCT A STUDY ON THE REIMPLEMENTATION OF ADULT DENTAL BENEFITS FOR HAWAII RESIDENTS WHO ARE MEDICAID ENROLLEES.

WHEREAS, access to regular dental care varies greatly 1 across the State, with many rural and neighbor island residents 2 and low-income families experiencing less access to regular 3 4 dental care than other residents; and 5 WHEREAS, the lack of access to dental insurance coverage 6 and dental care is a social justice issue that 7 disproportionately affects the poor, children, the elderly, and 8 9 racial and ethnic minority groups; and 10 WHEREAS, poor oral health can negatively impact an 11 individual's general health and self-image and has been linked 12 to an array of acute and chronic health conditions, including 13 heart disease, diabetes, strokes, depression, low birth weight, 14 15 premature births, and oral diseases; and 16 17 WHEREAS, oral diseases are a significant health problem 18 that affects the overall health and well-being of many Hawaii residents; and 19 20 WHEREAS, untreated oral diseases can result in a decrease 21 22 in or loss of workplace productivity due to absenteeism, under-23 employment, and unemployment; and 24 25 WHEREAS, the prevalence of oral diseases and tooth loss is disproportionately high among low-income residents, especially 26 among Medicaid enrollees; and 27 28 29 WHEREAS, receiving dental insurance coverage is a key factor in an individual's ability to access dental care; and 30 ्र



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WHEREAS, insufficient dental insurance coverage or access 1 2 to dental care may result in more severe health conditions and higher costs, further disadvantaging Medicaid enrollees; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, studies have shown that reducing or eliminating Medicaid adult dental benefits has led to significant national 6 7 increases in dental-related emergency room visits and associated 8 costs; and 9 10 WHEREAS, it has been nearly a decade since the State 11 removed all non-emergency Medicaid adult dental benefits; and 12 13 WHEREAS, it is in the public interest for the State to consider restoring dental benefits, including diagnostic, 14 15 preventive, and restorative dental benefits, and to expand 16 access to care for adult Medicaid enrollees; now, therefore, 17 18 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 19 Thirtieth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2020, the Senate concurring, the Department of Human Services is 20 urged to conduct a study on the reimplementation of adult dental 21 benefits for Hawaii residents who are Medicaid enrollees; and 22 23 24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the study shall include: 25 26 (1) A range of adult Medicaid dental benefit options, 27 including coverage of basic, comprehensive, and population specific benefits and coverage offered by 28 other states for diagnostic, preventive, and 29 30 restorative dental services: 31 32 (2) The estimated cost to the State's Medicaid program for 33 each option, including any costs that qualify for federal matching funds; 34 35 (3) 36 A projection, to the best of the Department of Human Services' ability, of the long-term financial benefit 37 38 of reimplementing adult dental benefits for Medicaid 39 enrollees; and 40 41 (4) Feedback from the community and stakeholders; and 42



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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED the Department of Human Services is requested to submit a report of its findings and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2021; and

9 of Human Services, and Director of Health.

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
