HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

DECLARING A CLIMATE EMERGENCY AND REQUESTING IMMEDIATE AND ACCELERATED ACTION TO ADDRESS THE CLIMATE CRISIS AND LIMIT GLOBAL WARMING TO 1.5 DEGREES CELSIUS.

WHEREAS, climate change is an urgent unfolding crisis that 1 presents a serious threat to global stability and human 2 existence: and 3 4 WHEREAS, in 2018, the United Nations Intergovernmental 5 Panel on Climate Change issued a special report on the impacts 6 of global warming and the need to reduce global greenhouse gas 7 emissions well before 2030 to hold warming to 1.5 degrees 8 celsius and avoid the most catastrophic impacts of climate 9 change; and 10 11 WHEREAS, also in 2018, the United States' Fourth National 12 Climate Assessment made clear that climate change will wreak 13 havoc across the United States, and the current pace and scale 14 15 of national climate action is not sufficient to prevent substantial damage to the economy, environment, and human health 16 in the coming decades; and 17 18 WHEREAS, throughout the United States, communities of 19 color, low-wage workers, and low-income communities have been on 20 21 the frontline of longstanding environmental injustices and have historically borne the brunt of the fossil fuel economy; and 22 23 WHEREAS, the State is already suffering from impacts of 24 climate change in the form of increases in wildfires, higher air 25 and ocean temperatures, coastal erosion from sea level rise, and 26 extreme rain events; and 27

WHEREAS, the State will suffer increased and more severe 1 impacts of climate change if global greenhouse gas emissions are 2 3 not significantly reduced; and 4 5 WHEREAS, climate change will continue to make basic human necessities such as food, housing, healthcare, transportation, 6 7 and energy more expensive and difficult to maintain, adding additional pressure to the State's high cost of living; and 8 9 10 WHEREAS, to stay within 1.5 degrees celsius, major populations throughout the world will need to significantly 11 reduce their per capita emissions by 2030, and Hawaii has 12 13 already taken some steps toward this goal; and 14 15 WHEREAS, Hawaii remains a global climate action leader by establishing a goal to reach one hundred percent carbon 16 17 neutrality by 2045; now, therefore, 18 19 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Thirtieth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 20 21 2020, the Senate concurring, that the State of Hawaii hereby 22 declares a state of climate emergency, given that the climate 23 crisis poses a serious and urgent threat to the well-being of 24 Hawaii, its inhabitants, and its environment; and 25 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that to meet the State's ambitious 26 27 greenhouse gas emission reduction targets, the Hawaii Climate Change Mitigation and Adaptation Commission is urged to make 28 29 recommendations for addressing key climate issues; and 30 31 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that as the State works on climate 32 issues, it is urged to continue to advance climate adaptation 33 efforts to address unavoidable current and future climate 34 impacts; and 35 36 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 37 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, mayors of

1 each county, and each member of the Hawaii Climate Mitigation 2 and Adaptation Commission. 3
