HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE MAYOR OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF HONOLULU AND THE HONOLULU CITY COUNCIL TO INSTALL AND MAINTAIN A NEW CAMERA SYSTEM IN DOWNTOWN AND CHINATOWN.

WHEREAS, the Chinatown Historic District in Honolulu is one 1 of the oldest Chinatowns in the United States, and Downtown 2 Honolulu is home to some of Oahu's most historic places; and 3 4 WHEREAS, it is important to maintain the safety of business 5 owners, workers, and patrons, as well as protect their property 6 and possessions; encourage commercial activity; and preserve the 7 8 history and culture of the Chinatown and Downtown Honolulu 9 areas; and 10 WHEREAS, crimes such as drug dealing, illegal gambling, 11 robbery, and purse snatching are plaguing business owners and 12 residents and dissuading visitors from visiting these areas; and 13 14 WHEREAS, in June 2018, a former Honolulu sports reporter 15 was beaten into a coma on Maunakea Street in Chinatown and 16 passed away soon after; and 17 18 WHEREAS, in October 2019, a fifty year-old man was robbed 19 at knifepoint in the Chinatown area; and 20 21 WHEREAS, in December 2019, an eighty year-old woman's bag 22 was snatched while she was waiting to start her early morning 23 tai chi class near the Nuuanu Stream; and 24 25 WHEREAS, a touchscreen visitor information kiosk depicting 26 the Honolulu mayor was destroyed when someone punched and broke 27 the glass screen; and 28 29

WHEREAS, a website entitled ChinatownWatch.com was created 1 by a small business owner displaying people defecating on the 2 sidewalks, drinking alcohol in public, vandalism, such as 3 graffiti, broken shop and car windows, and illegal dumping of 4 garbage; and 5 6 7 WHEREAS, there is concern about the recent increase in and severity of criminal activity, and business owners and residents 8 9 in Chinatown are calling for immediate assistance to victims of crime in the area; and 10 11 12 WHEREAS, the cameras monitoring the Chinatown area currently do not work; and 13 14 15 WHEREAS, installing a new camera system in Chinatown would improve public safety by deterring criminal activity, as well as 16 providing more immediate assistance to victims once a crime has 17 been committed; now, therefore, 18 19 20 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Thirtieth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 21 2020, the Senate concurring, that the Mayor of the City and 22 County of Honolulu and Honolulu City Council are strongly urged 23 to install and maintain a new camera system in the Downtown and 24 25 Chinatown areas; and 26 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 27 28 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Mayor of the City and County of Honolulu, Chair of the Honolulu City Council, 29 Chief of the Honolulu Police Department, and Chair of the 30 Downtown-Chinatown Neighborhood Board. 31 32 33 34 OFFERED BY: Ind.
