HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES TO ADDRESS MICROPLASTICS BY DESIGNATING PERSONNEL, IMPLEMENTING TECHNOLOGY, AND ESTABLISHING A PILOT PROJECT AT KAILUA BEACH PARK TO DEPLOY AND TEST NEW SAND-CLEANING TECHNOLOGIES FOR STATEWIDE USE.

WHEREAS, Hawaii is known worldwide for its beautiful 1 beaches and rich ocean habitat that have provided residents with 2 sustenance, recreational opportunities, and other resources for 3 4 generations; and 5 WHEREAS, Hawaii's location in the center of the Pacific 6 7 Ocean, just east of the Great Pacific Garbage Patch, ensures that countless tons of marine debris from around the world, 8 including very small pieces of plastic particles known as 9 microplastics, wash up on the State's beaches; and 10 11 WHEREAS, the health of our beaches, ocean resources, and 12 fragile marine ecosystems are seriously threatened by pollution 13 from microplastics; and 14 15 WHEREAS, scientists have documented at least six hundred 16 ninety species of wildlife that have been impacted by the 17 ingestion of microplastics, including the beloved green sea 18 turtles, which lay their eggs on the State's beaches; and 19 20 21 WHEREAS, plankton, invertebrates, fish, sea birds, and marine mammals are also all known to absorb, ingest, or 22 otherwise uptake microplastics; and 23 24 WHEREAS, the microplastics absorbed or ingested by these 25 26 organisms eventually impact humans as the microplastics make their way up the food chain; and 27



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WHEREAS, because microplastics are less than five 1 2 millimeters in size, it is extremely difficult to remove them from the environment; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, although microplastics are deposited at beaches statewide, Kailua Beach on the island of Oahu has been 6 7 especially prone to microplastic pollution due to onshore winds and other natural conditions; and 8 9 WHEREAS, despite regular beach cleanups by volunteer 10 groups, including a recent clean-up effort that resulted in the 11 12 removal of five thousand pounds of plastics, the ocean continually deposits new plastic debris onto Kailua Beach; and 13 14 15 WHEREAS, Kailua Beach has consistently been voted as one of the best beaches in the United States; however, the continued 16 17 influx of plastics onto Kailua Beach may threaten the beach's reputation and status as a gathering place for residents and 18 visitors; and 19 20 WHEREAS, researchers have been developing new technologies 21 to remove microplastics from the coastline, including one used 22 23 in a recent pilot project conducted by the University of Hawaii at Hilo, the Hawaii Wildlife Fund, and engineering students from 24 the Université de Sherbrooke in Québec, Canada, that tested a 25 26 machine designed to filter microplastics from sand at Kamilo Point on Hawaii Island; and 27 28 29 WHEREAS, the State must support efforts like the pilot program at Kamilo Point in order to find viable solutions to 30 protect our beaches from microplastic pollution, with the 31 ultimate goal of deploying these solutions statewide; now, 32 therefore, 33 34 35 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Thirtieth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 36 37 2020, the Senate concurring, that the Department of Land and Natural Resources is urged to specifically address microplastics 38 39 by designating personnel to address the issue and implementing technology that removes microplastic debris from the sand and 40 ocean water; and 41



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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Land and Natural Resources is urged to develop and implement a pilot program at Kailua Beach, which has been subject to disproportionately large sums of microplastics, to deploy and test new sand-cleaning technologies for statewide use; and

7 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Land and 8 Natural Resources is requested to submit a report of its 9 findings and recommendations, including any proposed 10 legislation, to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior 11 to the convening of the Regular Session of 2021; and 12

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Chairperson of the
Board of Land and Natural Resources and Director of the
Department of Parks and Recreation of the City and County of
Honolulu.
