

## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THAT THE DIRECTOR OF TRANSPORTATION AND DIRECTOR OF FACILITY MAINTENANCE OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF HONOLULU EACH SUBMIT A REPORT TO THE LEGISLATURE REGARDING THE TOTAL NUMBER OF CLAIMS RECEIVED AND DISBURSEMENTS MADE BY THEIR DEPARTMENTS FOR VEHICULAR DAMAGE CAUSED BY POOR ROAD CONDITIONS IN 2019.

WHEREAS, Hawaii's roads, consistently ranked as some of the 1 worst roads in the country, make driving a high anxiety 2 experience, cause vehicular damage, increase the cost of vehicle 3 ownership, and negatively impact visitors' image of Hawaii; and 4 5 6 WHEREAS, among other poor road conditions, potholes can cause drivers to suddenly brake or swerve, which could cause 7 traffic accidents, while driving into a pothole can cause 8 9 vehicular damage; and 10 WHEREAS, according to the Federal Highway Administration, 11 forty-two percent of Hawaii's roads are in poor condition, 12 costing drivers an average of \$764 annually in tire, wheel, and 13 suspension component repairs; and 14 15 WHEREAS, individuals may file claims and pursue legal 16 action against the City and County of Honolulu and Department of 17 Transportation for damages to their vehicles caused by poor road 18 conditions; and 19 20 WHEREAS, the City and County of Honolulu receives notice of 21 potholes primarily through a pothole hotline where drivers are 22 23 expected to pull over and call the hotline; and 24 WHEREAS, this body finds that relying solely on drivers' 25 26 complaints to determine road conditions that are in need of repair is ineffective; and 27



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1 WHEREAS, poor road conditions are often blamed on the 2 extreme weather conditions in Hawaii; however, research shows 3 that potholes and poor road conditions may depend more on the 4 construction parameters of the road, including factors such as 5 the material and thickness of asphalt used in the road's base 6 and surface layers; and

8 WHEREAS, Hawaii has intense rains which cause potholes to 9 appear throughout the year, but Hawaii continues to lay thinner 10 surface layers of asphalt on its roads than states with less 11 rainfall, such as California; and

WHEREAS, other materials like concrete have proven to be
longer lasting and require less maintenance than asphalt;
however, Hawaii continues to use asphalt on most roads due to
the high initial cost of laying concrete; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 18 19 Thirtieth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2020, the Senate concurring, that the Director of Transportation 20 and Director of Facility Maintenance of the City and County of 21 22 Honolulu are requested to each submit a report to the Legislature regarding the total number of claims received and 23 disbursements made by their respective departments for vehicular 24 damage caused by poor road conditions in 2019; and 25 26

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Director of Transportation and Director of Facility Maintenance are requested to explore the various methods and technologies in use in other jurisdictions to provide notification of roads needing maintenance, including real time departmental monitoring and other methods of reporting road conditions, and each submit a report on their findings and the feasibility of incorporating such methods; and 34

35 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Director of Transportation 36 and Director of Facility Maintenance are requested to explore 37 the effectiveness of the specifications of road materials 38 currently in use in their respective jurisdiction and determine 39 the feasibility of adjusting these specifications to increase 40 the durability and life expectancy of such materials, including 41 increasing the thickness of asphalt or using stronger materials



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such as concrete or newly developed materials or technologies; 1 2 and 3 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Director of Transportation 4 5 and Director of Facility Maintenance are requested to each conduct a cost benefit analysis of incorporating methods 6 described in this concurrent resolution to improve the overall 7 road conditions across the City and County of Honolulu and 8 9 State; and 10 11 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Director of Transportation and Director of Facility Maintenance are requested to submit 12 reports of their findings and recommendations, including any 13 proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later than twenty 14 days before the convening of the Regular Session of 2021; 15 16 provided that the Director of Transportation and Director of Facility Maintenance may mutually agree to jointly prepare and 17 submit their reports as a consolidated report to the 18 19 Legislature; and 20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 21 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Director of 22 Transportation, Mayor of the City and County of Honolulu, 23 24 members of the Honolulu City Council, and Director of Facility Maintenance of the City and County of Honolulu. 25 26 27 28 OFFERED BY:

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
