## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION TO ESTABLISH A DEDICATED TWENTY-FOUR-HOUR HOTLINE FOR REPORTING HAZARDOUS ROAD CONDITIONS.

1 WHEREAS, the American Society of Civil Engineers' 2019
2 Hawaii Infrastructure Report Card gave Hawaii's roadways a D+
3 rating, and the Reason Foundation's Annual Highway Report ranked
4 Hawaii forty-seventh in the nation for highway performance and
5 cost-effectiveness; and
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7 WHEREAS, Hawaii's transportation system currently consists 8 of nearly ten thousand lane miles that are managed and 9 maintained by the State, the counties, or private owners; and 10

WHEREAS, currently, there exist multiple telephone numbers for members of the public to report road-related issues to the State and the counties, and there is no readily available compilation of private owners' contact information for reporting issues on privately owned roads; and

WHEREAS, the City and County of Honolulu publishes three different telephone numbers for pothole reporting and a person wishing to make a report must first determine whether the road in question is maintained by the State, a county, the Honolulu Authority for Rapid Transportation, or a private owner; and

WHEREAS, the City and County of Honolulu has an online reporting tool for roads that it maintains, but the City and County does not respond to reports involving roads outside of its jurisdiction and does not provide information about the ownership of these roads or the appropriate party to contact; and



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1 WHEREAS, uncertainty about road ownership may prevent members of the public from promptly reporting potentially 2 hazardous road conditions, which may in turn prevent timely 3 4 responses to road hazards and lead to an increase in traffic 5 accidents; and 6 7 WHEREAS, Hawaii residents already rely on the Department of 8 Transportation to determine road ownership and coordinate 9 repairs, but existing reporting methods heavily burden residents by requiring them to first determine the appropriate entity to 10 11 contact for road management; and 12 WHEREAS, the public is more likely to report hazardous or 13 14 potentially hazardous road conditions if there exists an easy 15 and efficient way to do so; now, therefore, 16 17 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Thirtieth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 18 2020, the Senate concurring, that the Department of 19 20 Transportation is requested to establish a dedicated twenty-21 four-hour hotline for members of the public to report hazardous 22 or potentially hazardous road conditions, including potholes; and 23 24 25 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Transportation consider the following criteria when establishing 26 the hotline: 27 28 29 That the hotline telephone number be easy for the (1) 30 public to locate on the Department of Transportation's website and easy to remember; 31 32 (2) That the hotline be available twenty-four-hours a day, 33 34 seven days a week, including state holidays; 35 36 (3) That the hotline function as a clearinghouse for all telephone calls regarding hazardous or potentially 37 38 hazardous road conditions, regardless of whether the 39 road is owned by the State, a county, or a private entity; and 40



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(4) That all road conditions reported to the hotline be promptly forwarded to the appropriate entity for processing and resolution; and

5 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Transportation is requested to submit an annual report to the 6 Legislature that includes the number of telephone calls received 7 8 by the hotline and the disposition of each issue reported to the 9 hotline, no later than twenty days prior to the convening of each Regular Session, beginning with the Regular Session of 10 2021, and to make the reports available on the Department's 11 official website; and 12

14 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Director of 15 16 Transportation; respective Mayors of the Counties of Hawaii, Maui, Kauai, and the City and County of Honolulu; Director of 17 Public Works of the County of Hawaii; Director of Transportation 18 of the County of Maui; Executive of Transportation of the County 19 of Kauai; and Director of Transportation Services of the City 20 and County of Honolulu. 21 22
