HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE CITY AND COUNTY OF HONOLULU TO WORK WITH THE HONOLULU AUTHORITY FOR RAPID TRANSPORTATION TO MOVE THE HONOLULU RAIL TRANSIT PROJECT INLAND DUE TO SEA LEVEL RISE.

WHEREAS, a study by the Hawaii Climate Change Mitigation 1 and Adaptation Commission found that the State will begin 2 experiencing significant flooding due to climate change as early 3 as 2030; and 4 5 WHEREAS, this flooding is projected to damage 6 7 infrastructure, harm businesses, and render uninhabitable certain areas of the State; and 8 9 WHEREAS, in response to these findings, the Mayor of the 10 City and County of Honolulu issued a formal directive in July 11 2018, requiring each city department and agency to consider 12 climate change mitigation and adaptation as pressing and urgent 13 matters, including protection and preparation of the city's 14 infrastructure, assets, and citizens for any physical and 15 economic impacts of climate change; and 16 17 WHEREAS, the last section of the Honolulu rail transit 18 19 project extends from Middle Street to Ala Moana Center, which is an area of Oahu that is most threatened by sea level rise; and 20 21 WHEREAS, in 2030, shortly after the Honolulu rail transit 22 23 project's anticipated completion date, flooding from Kalihi Street is projected to impact the Middle Street Transit Center; 24 25 and 26 WHEREAS, by 2050, more than one foot of sea level rise is 27 projected to begin inundating areas around the planned Kapalama 28 29 and Kakaako Honolulu rail transit stations; and

WHEREAS, by 2100, sea level rise is anticipated to cause 1 2 flooding of the entire urban rail route; and 3 4 WHEREAS, with threats of flooding in mind, the Honolulu 5 rail transit project was designed as an elevated system with concrete pillars and raised platforms; and 6 7 8 WHEREAS, paradoxically, the City and County of Honolulu is relying on transit-oriented development to generate additional 9 10 property tax revenues to fund the maintenance and operations costs of the Honolulu rail transit system, as well as to help 11 12 alleviate Oahu's affordable housing crisis; and 13 14 WHEREAS, the City and County of Honolulu's plan encourages massive development in areas threatened by repeated and 15 16 devastating flooding as early as thirty years from the present; and 17 18 19 WHEREAS, moving the Honolulu rail transit project inland 20 will save rail and its accompanying development from sea level rise, encourage transit-oriented development for everyday 21 22 families rather than just those who can afford luxury condominiums in Kakaako, avoid costly mitigating factors, and 23 24 allow time to reevaluate an expansion of the Honolulu rail transit project to the University of Hawaii at Manoa; now, 25 therefore, 26 27 28 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Thirtieth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 29 30 2020, the Senate concurring, that the City and County of Honolulu is requested to work with the Honolulu Authority for 31 32 Rapid Transportation to move the Honolulu rail transit project inland due to sea level rise; and 33 34 35 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor; Director 36 of Transportation; Director of Business, Economic Development, 37 and Tourism; Mayor of the City and County of Honolulu; 38 39 Chairperson of the Honolulu Authority for Rapid Transportation
