HOUSE RESOLUTION

RECOGNIZING AND CONGRATULATING THE 2019 HAWAII HEALTHCARE HEROES FOR DELIVERING OUTSTANDING AND EXEMPLARY CARE TO PATIENTS AND THEIR FAMILIES ACROSS THE STATE.
