## HOUSE RESOLUTION

URGING THE LEGISLATURE TO CREATE A WORKING GROUP TO DETERMINE HOW TO EXPAND DUAL CREDIT ACCESS.

WHEREAS, the state must actively seek ways to improve and
 increase access to education using technology and innovation to
 create opportunities for students; and

5 WHEREAS, programs like dual credit and early start have 6 been proven to have a positive correlation for students 7 enrolling in college, enhancing college performance, and 8 completing a bachelors program; and 9

10 WHEREAS, low-income families and those in rural areas are 11 inadvertently excluded from these programs. Many rural students 12 and their families do not have the time or resources to travel 13 to participating colleges. Students from low-income families may 14 be barred from these programs due to lack of affordability; and 15

16 WHEREAS, technological advances and ever evolving distance 17 learning curriculums afford the opportunity to create programs 18 that are more inclusive of any child who meets the 19 qualifications and has the will and desire to start college 20 early; and

WHEREAS, several separate entities are currently providing dual credit programs and they should be encouraged to create a united effort in overcoming obstacles that hinder Hawaii's children from reaching their potential; now, therefore, 26

2020, urges a working group be created to explore increasing
access to dual credit programs; and
