Programs

CADR designs and helps implement alternative dispute resolution (ADR) programs for state and county governments. The programs encourage parties to avoid unnecessary litigation and encourage early and fair conflict resolution.

- Administered the Hawai'i Appellate Mediation Program from its inception in 1995 to the end of June 2019, the Hawai'i Appellate Mediation Program brought in 720 cases, with nine active (pending mediation). Of the 711 cases that have concluded, 53 percent have settled or partially settled. During FY 2018-2019, the Hawai'i Appellate Mediation program settled or partially settled 10 cases.
- Assisted the Family Court, First Judicial Circuit, with the Volunteer Settlement Master Program.
- Played a significant role in the revitalization of the workplace mediation program and, during FY 2018-2019, led the statewide launch under its new name the Workplace Dispute Resolution Program (WDRP). The WDRP, which provides additional options for judiciary employees to resolve workplace disputes, is administered by CADR.

Direct Services

CADR provides mediation, facilitation, and process design services for cases involving public policy.

• Conducted two National Issues Forum Institute: *A House Divided – What Would We Have to Give Up to Get the Political System We Want*? and *Coming To America – Who Should We Welcome, What Should We Do*?
