# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CHILD CARE.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Hawaii has some of 2 the nation's highest child care costs, and a lack of access to 3 affordable child care is a burden to families and contributes 4 substantially to the State's high cost of living. According to 5 a report by the national clearinghouse Child Care Aware, Hawaii 6 ranks as the eighth least affordable state for center-based 7 infant child care and the tenth least affordable state for 8 center-based toddler care. The average annual cost of center-9 based infant care in the State is \$13,704, which is more than 10 the cost of annual in-state tuition at the University of Hawaii 11 at Manoa. The annual cost of center-based toddler care, at **12** \$11,664, is similarly high.
- The legislature further finds that there is a great unmet need for child care in the State. There are an estimated 66,262 children in Hawaii under the age of six who potentially need child care. This stands in contrast to the 35,662 child care slots that are available in the State. Both the high cost and

- 2 families in Hawaii to work and thrive.
- 3 The legislature finds that providing child care to State
- 4 employees and their families can help address the State's child
- 5 care needs. Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to
- 6 establish two child care centers on Oahu for state employees and
- 7 their families, specifically one in or around the state capitol
- 8 building and one in Kapolei.
- 9 SECTION 2. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by
- 10 adding a new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read
- 11 as follows:
- 12 "CHAPTER
- 13 STATE EMPLOYEE CHILD CARE CENTERS
- 14 § -1 Definitions. As used in this chapter:
- 15 "Child care center" means a group child care center as
- 16 defined in section 346-151.
- 17 "Department" means the department of accounting and general
- 18 services.
- 19 "Eligible children" are children who have a parent,
- 20 grandparent, aunt, uncle, or legal quardian who is an employee
- 21 of the State.



- 1 "Employee" means any full-time employee of the State,
- 2 including any appointed or elected officer, legislator, justice,
- 3 or judge.
- 4 § -2 Child care centers for eligible children of state
- 5 employees; established. (a) The department, by contract, shall
- 6 establish, equip, and operate on the island of Oahu two child
- 7 care centers for eligible children of state employees; provided
- 8 that one child care center shall be located in or near the state
- 9 capitol building and one child care center shall be located in
- 10 Kapolei.
- 11 (b) Child care centers established under this section may
- 12 be located in state-owned office buildings, educational
- 13 facilities and institutions, custodial facilities and
- 14 institutions, and buildings or spaces used for legislative
- 15 activities. Centers may also be located in privately owned
- 16 facilities located in convenient proximity to the place of
- 17 employment of the employees to be served by the centers.
- 18 (c) An operator of a child care center under this section
- 19 shall be selected in accordance with chapter 103D.
- 20 (d) The child care centers established under this section
- 21 shall provide full-time child care during weekdays on which a

- 1 majority of state employees are on duty, beginning at least one
- 2 half hour before the regular work day begins and ending no
- 3 earlier than one half hour after that work day ends.
- 4 (e) The department, by rule, may establish fees to be
- 5 charged to employees to offset the cost of providing child care
- 6 services; provided that the fees shall be as minimal as is
- 7 practicable.
- 8 (f) The department may accept money, equipment, or other
- 9 property donated for use in connection with the provision of
- 10 child care services.
- 11 (g) Nothing in this section shall be construed to prohibit
- 12 a child care center established under this section from
- 13 accepting children of non-state employees if space is available;
- 14 provided that fees charged for services shall be as minimal as
- 15 practicable.
- (h) The department shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter
- 17 91 as necessary to implement this chapter."
- 18 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 19 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
- 20 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2019-2020 and the

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- 1 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
- 2 2020-2021 to carry out the purposes of this Act.
- 3 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 4 of accounting and general services for the purposes of this Act.
- 5 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2019.
