A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PLANNING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that disaster recovery			
2	efforts need to be carried out quickly and efficiently to ensure			
3	that damaged infrastructure and interrupted services are			
4	restored as soon as possible. Prudent pre-disaster planning, as			
5	well as post-disaster responses that seek to make the State less			
6	vulnerable regarding future disasters, can expedite responses			
7	that anticipate future needs. For example, if a road is			
8	destroyed by an ocean wave surge caused by a hurricane, it may			
9	be best to build the replacement road further inland, where it			
10	is less vulnerable. These types of scenarios should be			
11	evaluated before an actual disaster occurs.			
12	Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to require:			
13	(1) The State and counties to incorporate predictions of			
14	sea level rise and other climate change hazards and			
15	mitigation opportunities into applicable plans,			
16	strategies, and mapping, in order to increase the

10	SECTION 2. Chapter 226, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
11	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated		
12	and to rea	ad as follows:	
13	" <u>§226</u>	5- Climate change hazards a	nd mitigation planning;
14	required.	The State and each county sha	all incorporate
15	evaluations, predictions, and recommendations pertaining to		
16	climate change hazards and mitigation into their respective		
17	multi-hazard mitigation plans. Those plans, at a minimum, shal		
18	incorporat	te findings of the "Hawaii Sea	Level Rise Vulnerability
19	and Adapta	ation Report" prepared by the I	Hawaii climate change
20	mitigation and adaptation commission."		

1 SECTION 3. Chapter 269, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated 3 and to read as follows: 4 "§269- Sea level rise vulnerability; infrastructure 5 sites. Notwithstanding any provision in this chapter to the 6 contrary, the public utilities commission shall consider in all 7 of its actions the findings in the "Hawaii Sea Level Rise 8 Vulnerability and Adaptation Report" prepared by the Hawaii 9 climate change mitigation and adaptation commission and shall 10 seek to avoid critical electrical infrastructure projects in 11 areas of higher risk to reduce risk to taxpayers and the general 12 public." 13 SECTION 4. In devising pre-disaster planning and post-14 disaster recovery strategies, the State and each county shall 15 develop and establish comprehensive frameworks, state functional 16 plans, county general plans, and community development plans 17 addressing sea level rise adaptation strategies. 18 SECTION 5. Beginning on the effective date of this Act, 19 all floodplain mapping supported by state or county funding shall include information from the "Hawaii Sea Level Rise 20 21 Vulnerability and Adaptation Report" prepared by the Hawaii

- 1 climate change mitigation and adaptation commission that
- 2 anticipates sea level rise and floodplains in terms of a one
- 3 hundred year flood, as defined by the United States Geological
- 4 Survey.

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- 5 SECTION 6. Each county shall participate in the community
- 6 rating system developed by the National Flood Insurance Program.
- 7 SECTION 7. New statutory material is underscored.
- 8 SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

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Report Title:

Disasters; Planning; Recovery; Climate Change; Sea Level Rise; Infrastructure Sites; Public Utilities Commission

Description:

Requires the State and counties to incorporate predictions of sea level rise and other climate change hazards and mitigation opportunities into applicable plans, strategies, and mapping. Requires the public utilities commission to consider the findings in the Hawaii Sea Level Rise Vulnerability and Adaptation Report. Requires each county to participate in the community rating system developed by the National Flood Insurance Program.

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
