## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PLANNING.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that disaster recovery
2	efforts need to be carried out quickly and efficiently to ensure
3	that damaged infrastructure and interrupted services are
4	restored as soon as possible. Prudent pre-disaster planning, as
5	well as post-disaster responses that seek to make the State less
6	vulnerable regarding future disasters, can expedite responses
7	that anticipate future needs. For example, if a road is
8	destroyed by an ocean wave surge caused by a hurricane, it may
9	be best to build the replacement road further inland, where it
10	is less vulnerable. These types of scenarios should be
11	evaluated before an actual disaster occurs.
12	Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to require:
13	(1) The State and counties to incorporate predictions of
14	sea level rise and other climate change hazards and
15	mitigation opportunities into applicable plans,
16	strategies, and mapping, in order to increase the

1		State's resiliency and ability to properly respond to
2		natural disasters; and
3	(2)	The public utilities commission, and any public
4		utility regulated by the public utilities commission,
5		to consider in its actions the findings in the Hawaii
6		Sea Level Rise Vulnerability and Adaptation Report by
7		the Hawaii climate change mitigation and adaptation
8		commission and seek to avoid critical infrastructure
9		projects in areas of higher risk, in order to reduce
10		risks to taxpayers and the general public.
11	SECT	ION 2. Chapter 226, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
12	amended b	y adding a new section to be appropriately designated
13	and to re	ad as follows:
14	" <u>§22</u>	6- Climate change hazards and mitigation planning;
15	required.	The State and each county shall incorporate
16	evaluatio	ns, predictions, and recommendations pertaining to
17	climate c	hange hazards and mitigation into their respective
18	multi-haz	ard mitigation plans. Those plans, at a minimum, shall
19	incorpora	te findings of the "Hawaii Sea Level Rise Vulnerability
20	and Adapt	ation Report" prepared by the Hawaii climate change
21	mitigatio	n and adaptation commission."

1	SECTION 3. Chapter 269, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated		
3	and to read as follows:		
4	"§269- Sea level rise vulnerability; infrastructure		
5	sites. (a) Notwithstanding any provision in this chapter to		
6	the contrary, the public utilities commission shall:		
7	(1) Consider in its actions the findings in the "Hawaii		
8	Sea Level Rise Vulnerability and Adaptation Report";		
9	and		
10	(2) Seek to avoid critical infrastructure projects in		
11	areas of higher risk to reduce risk to taxpayers and		
12	the general public.		
13	(b) Any public utility regulated by the public utilities		
14	commission shall incorporate the findings of the "Hawaii Sea		
15	Level Rise Vulnerability and Adaptation Report" into the		
16	utility's capital investment planning processes in any relevant		
17	applications and regular reports that may be filed with the		
18	public utilities commission.		
19	(c) As used in this section, "Hawaii Sea Level Rise		
20	Vulnerability and Adaptation Report" means the "Hawaii Sea Level

- 2 climate change mitigation and adaptation commission."
- 3 SECTION 4. In devising pre-disaster planning and post-
- 4 disaster recovery strategies, the State and each county shall
- 5 develop and establish comprehensive frameworks, state functional
- 6 plans, county general plans, and community development plans
- 7 addressing sea level rise adaptation strategies.
- 8 SECTION 5. Each county is encouraged to participate in the
- 9 community rating system developed by the National Flood
- 10 Insurance Program.
- 11 SECTION 6. New statutory material is underscored.
- 12 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.

## Report Title:

Disasters; Planning; Recovery; Climate Change; Sea Level Rise; Infrastructure Sites; Counties; PUC

## Description:

Requires the State and counties to incorporate predictions of sea level rise and other climate change hazards and mitigation opportunities into applicable plans, strategies, and mapping. Requires the Public Utilities Commission, and any public utility regulated by the Public Utilities Commission, to consider the findings in the Hawaii Sea Level Rise Vulnerability and Adaptation Report. Encourages each county to participate in the community rating system developed by the National Flood Insurance Program. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)

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
