BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. Section 226-21, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by	y amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
3	"(b)	To achieve the education objective, it shall be the
4	policy of	this State to:
5	(1)	Support educational programs and activities that
6		enhance personal development, physical fitness,
7		recreation, and cultural pursuits of all groups.
8	(2)	Ensure the provision of adequate and accessible
9		educational services and facilities that are designed
10		to meet individual and community needs.
11	(3)	Provide appropriate educational opportunities for
12		groups with special needs.
13	(4)	Promote educational programs which enhance
14		understanding of Hawaii's cultural heritage.
15	(5)	Provide higher educational opportunities that enable
16		Hawaii's people to adapt to changing employment
17		demands.



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1	(6)	Assist individuals, especially those experiencing
2		critical employment problems or barriers, or
3		undergoing employment transitions, by providing
4		appropriate employment training programs and other
5		related educational opportunities.
6	(7)	Promote programs and activities that facilitate the
7		acquisition of basic skills, such as reading, writing,
8		computing, listening, speaking, and reasoning.
9	(8)	Emphasize quality educational programs in Hawaii's
10		institutions to promote academic excellence.
11	(9)	Support research programs and activities that enhance
12		the education programs of the State.
13	(10)	Promote civics learning in the K-12 curriculum."
14	SECT	ION 2. Section 226-107, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
15	amended t	o read as follows:

18	(1)	Pursue effective programs which reflect the varied
19		district, school, and student needs to strengthen

4	(3)	Initiate efforts to improve the quality of education
5		by improving the capabilities of the education

7	(4)	Promote increased opportunities for greater autonomy
8		and flexibility of educational institutions in their
9		decision-making responsibilities;
10	(5)	Increase and improve the use of information technology
11		in education by the availability of telecommunications
12		equipment for:
13		(A) The electronic exchange of information;
14		(B) Statewide electronic mail; and
15		(C) Access to the Internet.
