A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO VOTING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that automatic voter
 registration, also known as "motor voter", provides eligible
 voters an opportunity to register to vote when applying for or
 renewing a driver's license unless the eligible voter
 affirmatively declines to be registered. As of December 2018,
 sixteen states and the District of Colombia have authorized
 automatic voter registration.

8 Proponents believe that automatic voter registration 9 assists in removing barriers to registration for eligible 10 voters, which is the first step to voter participation. Voter 11 registration through a routine and necessary transaction, such 12 as driver's licensing, increases voter registration efficiency 13 and effectiveness and voter turnout.

14 The purpose of this Act is to establish an automatic voter 15 registration system to allow any person who is eligible to vote 16 but not already registered to vote and applies for a new or 17 renewed motor vehicle driver's license, provisional license, or



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1 instruction permit, or a new, renewed, or duplicate 2 identification card to be automatically registered to vote, 3 unless the applicant affirmatively declines to be registered to 4 vote. 5 SECTION 2. Chapter 11, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended 6 by adding a new section to part II to be appropriately 7 designated and to read as follows: 8 "<u>§11-</u> Automatic registration. (a) Notwithstanding any 9 law to the contrary, an affidavit on an application for voter 10 registration shall be a part of the application associated with 11 the issuance of an identification card under section 286-301 and a driver's license under section 286-109. Each application 12 13 shall include a space to request a permanent absentee ballot and 14 also include the address the person wishes the requested ballot 15 to be forwarded. This section shall satisfy the requirements 16 pursuant to section 15-4(a). 17 (b) Applications for an identification card or driver's license shall not be processed until the applicant clearly 18 19 indicates on the application that the applicant declines to 20 register to vote or completes the portion of the application 21 related to voter registration. Unless an applicant



1	affirmatively declines to be registered to vote, the submission	
2	of the application shall be deemed to authorize the examiner of	
3	drivers to collect and transmit the information necessary to	
4	register the applicant as a voter, and the examiner of drivers	
5	shall electronically transmit the necessary information to the	
6	clerk of the county in which the applicant resides and election	
7	officials and the statewide voter registration system pursuant	
8	to subsection (d). The examiner of drivers shall not transmit	
9	any information necessary to register an applicant as a voter if	
10	that applicant affirmatively declines to be registered to vote.	
11	(c) Upon receipt of the completed voter registration	
12	application transmitted from the examiner of drivers, the clerk	
13	shall review and approve or reject the voter registration	
14	application in accordance with this part; provided that approved	
15	voter registration applications received from the examiner of	
16	drivers pursuant to this section shall be treated as having a	
17	valid signature for purposes of section 11-15(c) whether by	
18	electronic or facsimile transmission. Upon approval of the	
19	voter registration application, the clerk shall proceed to	
20	number the application and register the name of the voter in the	
21	general county register as provided in section 11-14.	



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1	(d) Databases maintained or operated by the counties or			
2	the department of transportation containing driver's license or			
3	identification card information, including any documents or			
4	images, shall be directly accessible and provided electronically			
5	to election officials and the statewide voter registration			
6	system to allow for the timely processing of voter applications,			
7	ensure the integrity of the voter registration polls, and for			
8	any other government purpose, as determined by the director of			
9	transportation; provided that the chief election officer makes a			
10	request to the director of transportation for the electronic			
11	transmission of such information.			
12	(e) For purposes of this section, "applicant" means a			
13	person who is eligible to vote but is not registered to vote."			
14	SECTION 3. Chapter 286, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is			
15	amended by adding a new section to part VI to be appropriately			
16	designated and to read as follows:			
17	"§286-A Voter registration. (a) An applicant for a new			
18	or renewed motor vehicle driver's license, provisional license,			
19	or instruction permit shall automatically be registered to vote			
20	with the clerk of the appropriate county upon completion of the			
21	license or permit application as required in section 11-			

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1	unless the applicant affirmatively declines, on the application
2	form, to be registered to vote.
3	(b) Unless an applicant affirmatively declines to be
4	registered to vote, the submission of the application shall be
5	deemed to authorize the examiner of drivers to collect and
6	transmit the information necessary to register the applicant as
7	a voter, and the examiner of drivers shall electronically
8	transmit the necessary information to the clerk of the county in
9	which the applicant resides and election officials and the
10	statewide voter registration system pursuant to section
11	11- (d). The examiner of drivers shall not transmit any
12	information necessary to register an applicant as a voter if
13	that applicant affirmatively declines to vote.
14	(c) For the purposes of this section, "applicant" means a
15	person who is eligible to vote but is not registered to vote."
16	SECTION 4. Chapter 286, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
17	amended by adding a new section to part XVI to be appropriately
18	designated and to read as follows:
19	"§286-B Voter registration. (a) An applicant for a new,
20	renewed, or duplicate identification card shall automatically be
21	registered to vote with the clerk of the appropriate county upon



1	completion of an application for identification card as required
2	by section 11- unless the applicant affirmatively declines, on
3	the application form, to be registered to vote.
4	(b) Unless an applicant affirmatively declines to be
5	registered to vote, the submission of the application shall be
6	deemed to authorize the examiner of drivers to collect and
7	transmit the information necessary to register the applicant as
8	a voter, and the examiner of drivers shall electronically
9	transmit the necessary information to the clerk of the county in
10	which the applicant resides and election officials and the
11	statewide voter registration system pursuant to section
12	11- (d). The examiner of drivers shall not transmit any
13	information necessary to register an applicant as a voter if
14	that applicant affirmatively declines to vote.
15	(c) For the purposes of this section, "applicant" means a
16	person who is eligible to vote but is not registered to vote."
17	SECTION 5. Section 286-108, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
18	amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
19	"(a) Except as provided in section 286-107.5(a), the
20	examiner of drivers shall examine every applicant for a driver's



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1	license,	except as otherwise provided in this part. The
2	examinati	on shall include a test of:
3	(1)	The applicant's eyesight and any further physical
4		examination that the examiner of drivers finds
5		necessary to determine the applicant's fitness to
6		operate a motor vehicle safely upon the highways;
7	(2)	The applicant's ability to understand highway signs
8		regulating, warning, and directing traffic;
9	(3)	The applicant's knowledge of the rules of the road
10		based on the traffic laws of the State and the traffic
11		ordinances of the county where the applicant resides
12		or intends to operate a motor vehicle; provided that
13		the examination shall specifically test the
14		applicant's knowledge of [the provisions of section]
15		sections 291C-121.5 and [section] 291C-137; and
16	(4)	The actual demonstration of ability to exercise
17		ordinary and reasonable control in the operation of a
18		motor vehicle.
19	The exami	nations shall be appropriate to the operation of the
20	category	of motor vehicle for which the applicant seeks to be

21 licensed and shall be conducted as required by the director.



1 The examiner of drivers shall require every applicant to 2 comply with section 286-102.5. 3 The examiner of drivers may waive the actual demonstration 4 of ability to operate a motorcycle or motor scooter for any 5 person who furnishes evidence, to the satisfaction of the 6 examiner of drivers, that the person has completed the 7 motorcycle education course approved by the director in 8 accordance with section 431:10G-104. 9 [At the time of examination, an application for voter 10 registration by mail shall be made available to every applicant 11 for a driver's license.] 12 For the purposes of this section, the term "applicant" does 13 not include any person reactivating a license under section 14 286-107.5(a)." 15 SECTION 6. Section 286-109, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 16 amended to read as follows: 17 "§286-109 General provision governing the issuance of 18 licenses. (a) Upon payment of the required fee and upon 19 demonstrating the ability to operate a certain category or 20 categories of motor vehicles to the satisfaction of the examiner 21 of drivers, an applicant for a driver's license shall be issued



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1	a single	license of a design approved by the director [of
2	transport	ation] upon which is made a notation of:
3	(1)	The category or categories of motor vehicles the
4		applicant may operate;
5	(2)	Any restrictive provisions to which the license is
6		subject;
7	(3)	Veteran status, if desired by the applicant; provided
8		that the notation shall be on the front of the license
9		and shall not include any designation other than the
10		term "veteran"; and
11	(4)	When the license is issued to a person under twenty-
12		one years of age, a statement, in clearly legible
13		print that shall contrast with the other information
14		appearing on the license, which indicates the date on
15		which the person will attain the age of twenty-one
16		years.
17	As used i	n this subsection, "veteran" means any person who
18	served in	any of the uniformed services of the United States,
19	including	veterans of the Korean conflict and persons who served
20	in the ar	med forces of the Republic of Korea, who fought under
21	the comman	nd of the United Nations led by the United States,

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during the Korean conflict and are currently United States
 citizens, and was discharged under conditions other than
 dishonorable.

4 (b) The examiner of drivers shall not issue or renew any
5 driver's license using the driver's social security number on
6 the driver's license.

7 (c) Statutes of limitations and other provisions of this 8 chapter notwithstanding, no driver's license or instruction 9 permit shall be issued or renewed under this section, where the 10 examiner of drivers is notified by the district judge, traffic 11 violations bureaus of the district courts, or the judge of the 12 circuit court that the applicant has failed to respond to a 13 traffic citation or summons, or failed to appear in court after 14 an arrest for the violation of any traffic laws of a county, 15 this chapter or chapter 286G, 287, 290, 291, or 291C, or of any 16 motor vehicle insurance laws under article 10C of chapter 431, 17 or of any motorcycle or motor scooter insurance laws under 18 article 10G of chapter 431, and the same remains delinquent and 19 outstanding, or the applicant, has as of the time of the 20 application, failed to comply in full with all orders of the 21 court; provided that the district court with whose order an



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1 applicant has failed to comply in full, may approve the issuance 2 or renewal of a driver's license or instruction permit other 3 than a commercial driver's license upon conditions imposed by 4 the court for the satisfaction of the outstanding court order 5 and any other conditions as may be imposed by the court, if one 6 or more of the following conditions are met: 7 (1)The applicant is gainfully employed in a position that 8 requires driving and will be discharged if the 9 applicant is unable to drive; or 10 The applicant has no access to alternative (2) 11 transportation and therefore must drive to work; 12 provided further that if the applicant has failed to comply in 13 full with orders of the district court of more than one circuit, 14 the applicant shall obtain the approval of the district court of 15 each circuit in which the applicant has an outstanding court 16 order before a driver's license or instruction permit may be 17 issued or renewed under this subsection.

18 A driver's license or instruction permit issued or renewed 19 under this subsection shall be subject to immediate suspension 20 by the court upon the applicant's failure to remain in full 21 compliance with all conditions imposed by the court for the



1 issuance or renewal of the driver's license or instruction 2 permit. The examiner of drivers may place an indication of 3 restriction upon a driver's license or instruction permit issued or renewed under this subsection. Proof of financial 4 5 responsibility under section 287-20 shall not apply to the issuance or renewal of driver's licenses or instruction permits 6 7 under this subsection. 8 (d) An application for a driver's license shall include 9 the information required under section 11- ." 10 SECTION 7. Section 286-301, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 11 amended to read as follows: 12 "[+] §286-301[+] Issuance of identification card or 13 temporary card. (a) To obtain an identification card from the 14 examiner of drivers, an individual shall complete an application 15 pursuant to section 286-303. 16 (b) The examiner of drivers, upon receipt of the 17 application by any individual who is a resident or a temporary 18 resident of this State, shall issue an identification card to 19 that individual upon receipt of any appropriate fee established 20 pursuant to section 286-309.



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1 (c) The identification card shall be similar in size, 2 shape, and design to a driver's license, but shall not entitle 3 the individual to whom it is issued to operate a motor vehicle. 4 (d) The issuance of an identification card pursuant to 5 this section shall not place upon the State of Hawaii or any 6 agency any liability for the misuse or the acceptance of the 7 identification card as valid identification, which shall be left 8 entirely to the discretion of any individual to whom such card 9 is presented.

10 (e) An application for an identification card from the 11 examiner of drivers shall include the information required under 12 section 11- ."

13 SECTION 8. Section 286-311, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 14 amended by amending its title and subsection (a) to read as 15 follows:

"[+]§286-311[+] Custody and use of records; confidential
information. (a) [All] Except for purposes of sections 286-A,
286-B, 286-109, and 286-301, information and records acquired by
the examiner of drivers under this part shall be confidential.
All information and records shall be maintained in an

21 appropriate form and in an appropriate office in the custody and



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1 under the control of the examiner. The information shall be 2 available only to authorized individuals under such restrictions 3 as the director shall prescribe. The examiner may dispose of any application or identification card, or information or record 4 5 relating to the application or identification card, which does 6 not include a social security number, without regard to chapter 7 94, whenever, in the examiner's discretion, retention of the 8 information or record is no longer required or practicable."

9 SECTION 9. In codifying the new sections added by sections
10 3 and 4 of this Act, the revisor of statutes shall substitute
11 appropriate section numbers for the letters used in designating
12 the new sections in this Act.

13 SECTION 10. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed14 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

15 SECTION 11. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2019.

Report Title:

Automatic Voter Registration; Driver's License; Identification Card; Affirmative Opt-out

Description:

Requires that any person who is eligible to vote but is not already registered to vote and applies for a new or renewed motor vehicle driver's license, provisional license, or instruction permit, or a new, renewed, or duplicate civil identification card be automatically registered to vote unless the applicant affirmatively declines to be registered to vote. Authorizes access to and electronic transmission of databases maintained or operated by the counties or the department of transportation containing driver's license or civil identification card information to election officials and the statewide voter registration system.
