A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SPEEDY TRIAL.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that victims and
2	witnesses of sexual offenses are especially vulnerable and often
3	do not receive a speedy resolution of their cases in the legal
4	system. The legislature further finds that the lack of a right
5	to speedy trial for these crime victims and witnesses greatly
6	contributes to this phenomenon. Repeatedly postponing a trial
7	causes further harm by delaying the justice owed to crime
8	victims, causing many of them to give up hope of ever obtaining
9	vindication and recognition of their trauma and suffering. As a
10	result, a number of these crime victims eventually give up on
11	the prosecution of their cases and become uncooperative, thus
12	allowing the perpetrators to go unpunished.
13	The purpose of this Act is to:
14	(1) Establish the right of victims and witnesses to a
15	speedy trial in criminal cases involving sexual
16	offenses allegedly committed by adult defendants; and

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1	(2) Require courts to consider any substantial adverse
2	impact that postponing a trial may have on a victim or
3	witness in these types of cases, particularly if the
4	trial has been postponed once before.
5	SECTION 2. Chapter 571, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
6	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
7	and to read as follows:
8	"§571- Victims and witnesses; right to speedy trial in
9	certain adult cases. Victims and witnesses in cases involving
10	an offense charged under part V of chapter 707 shall have a
11	right to a speedy trial that is subordinate only to a
12	defendant's state and federal constitutional rights. When
13	considering a motion to postpone a trial in any of these cases
14	involving an adult defendant, the court shall consider the
15	totality of the circumstances, including:
16	(1) The defendant's right to a speedy trial; and
17	(2) A victim's or witness' right to a speedy trial,
18	including any substantial adverse impact that
19	postponing the trial may have on the victim or
20	witness, particularly if the trial has been postponed
21	once before."

1	SECTION 3. Chapter 604, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to read as follows:
4	"§604- Victims and witnesses; right to speedy trial in
5	certain cases. Victims and witnesses in cases involving an
6	offense charged under part V of chapter 707 shall have a right
7	to a speedy trial that is subordinate only to a defendant's
8	state and federal constitutional rights. When considering a
9	motion to postpone a trial in any of these cases, the court
10	shall consider the totality of the circumstances, including:
11	(1) The defendant's right to a speedy trial; and
12	(2) A victim's or witness' right to a speedy trial,
13	including any substantial adverse impact that
14	postponing the trial may have on the victim or
15	witness, particularly if the trial has been postponed
16	once before."
17	SECTION 4. Chapter 806, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
18	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
19	and to read as follows:
20	"§806- Victims and witnesses; right to speedy trial in
21	certain cases. Victims and witnesses in cases involving an

1	offense c	harged under part V of chapter 707 shall have a right
2	to a spee	dy trial that is subordinate only to a defendant's
3	state and	federal constitutional rights. When considering a
4	motion to	postpone a trial in any of these cases, the court
5	shall con	sider the totality of the circumstances, including:
6	(1)	The defendant's right to a speedy trial; and
7	(2)	A victim's or witness' right to a speedy trial,
8		including any substantial adverse impact that
9		postponing the trial may have on the victim or

12	SECT	ION 5. Section 801D-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
13	amended t	o read as follows:
14	"§80	1D-4 Basic bill of rights for victims and witnesses.
15	(a) Upon	written request, victims and surviving immediate
16	family me	mbers of crime shall have the following rights:
17	(1)	To be informed by the police and the prosecuting
18		attorney of the final disposition of the case. If the
19		crime charged is a felony, the victim or a surviving
20		immediate family member shall be notified of major
21		developments in the case and whenever the defendant or

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Ţ		perpetrator is released from custody. The victim or a
2		surviving immediate family member shall also be
3		consulted and advised about plea bargaining by the
4		prosecuting attorney;
5	(2)	To be notified by the prosecuting attorney if a court
6		proceeding to which they have been subpoenaed will not
7		proceed as scheduled;
8	(3)	To receive protection from threats or harm;
9	(4)	To be informed by the police, victim/witness
10		counselor, or other criminal justice personnel, of
11		financial assistance and other social services
12		available as a result of being a witness to or a
13		victim of crime, including information on how to apply
14		for the assistance and services;
15	(5)	To be provided by the court, whenever possible, with a
16		secure waiting area during court proceedings that does
17		not require them to be in close proximity to
18		defendants and families and friends of defendants;
19	(6)	To have any stolen or other personal property
20		expeditiously returned by law enforcement agencies
21	•	when the property is no longer needed as evidence. If

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	feasible, all the property[$_{\tau}$] except weapons[$_{\tau}$];
2	currency $[\tau]_{\underline{i}}$ contraband $[\tau]_{\underline{i}}$ property subject to
3	evidentiary analysis $[\tau]$; and property, the ownership
1	of which is disputed, shall be returned to the person
5	within ten days of being taken; and

- To be informed by the department of public safety of 6 (7) 7 changes planned by the department in the custodial status of the offender that allows or results in the 8 9 release of the offender into the community, including 10 escape, furlough, work release, placement on 11 supervised release, release on parole, release on bail 12 bond, release on appeal bond, and final discharge at 13 the end of the prison term.
- 14 Upon written request, the victim or the parent or 15 quardian of a minor or incapacitated victim of an offense under 16 section 707-730, 707-731, or 707-732(1)(a) shall have the right 17 to be informed of the human immunodeficiency virus (HIV) status 18 of the person who has been convicted or a juvenile who has been 19 adjudicated under that section and to receive counseling 20 The testing shall be performed according to the regarding HIV. 21 protocols set forth in section 325-17. Upon request of the

- 1 victim, or the parent or guardian of a minor or incapacitated
- 2 victim, the department of health shall provide counseling.
- 3 (c) Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the
- 4 department of public safety, the Hawaii paroling authority, the
- 5 judiciary probation divisions and branches, and the department
- 6 of the attorney general shall make good faith efforts to notify
- 7 the victim of a crime, or surviving immediate family members of
- 8 a victim, of income received by a person imprisoned for that
- 9 crime when the imprisoned person has received a civil judgment
- 10 that exceeds \$10,000, a civil settlement that exceeds \$10,000,
- 11 or any income that exceeds \$10,000 in one fiscal year, whenever
- 12 the income is known to the agency, and, in addition, the
- 13 department of public safety shall make good faith efforts to
- 14 notify the victim of a crime or surviving immediate family
- 15 members of a victim, whenever it is known to the agency that a
- 16 person imprisoned for that crime has a financial account, of
- 17 which the department of public safety is aware, of a value
- 18 exceeding \$10,000.
- (d) Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, payment of
- 20 restitution and judgments to victims, or surviving immediate
- 21 family members of a victim, shall be a precondition for release

- 1 on parole for any imprisoned person whom the Hawaii paroling
- 2 authority determines has the financial ability to make complete
- 3 or partial restitution payments or complete or partial judgment
- 4 payments to the victim of the person's crime, or to the
- 5 surviving immediate family members of a victim.
- 6 (e) Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the State of
- 7 Hawaii, any political subdivision of the State of Hawaii, any
- 8 department or agency of the State, any officer of the State, and
- 9 any employee of the State shall be immune from damages in any
- 10 lawsuit based on noncompliance with subsection (c) or (d).
- 11 Nothing in this subsection shall be construed to prevent
- 12 disciplinary action against any employee of the State who
- 13 intentionally fails to comply with subsection (c) or (d) after
- 14 being warned that compliance is required.
- 15 (f) Victims and witnesses in cases involving an offense
- 16 charged under part V of chapter 707 shall have a right to a
- 17 speedy trial that is subordinate only to a defendant's state and
- 18 federal constitutional rights. When considering a motion to
- 19 postpone a trial in any of these cases involving an adult
- 20 defendant, the court shall consider the totality of the
- 21 circumstances, including:

1	(1)	The defendant's right to a speedy trial; and
2	(2)	A victim's or witness' right to a speedy trial,
3		including any substantial adverse impact that
4		postponing the trial may have on the victim or
5		witness, particularly if the trial has been postponed
6		once before."
7	SECT	ION 6. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
8	matured, p	penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
9	begun befo	ore its effective date.
10	SECT	ION 7. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
11	and strick	ken. New statutory material is underscored.
12	SECT	ION 8. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
