A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO YOUTH SERVICES PROGRAMS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Chapter 352D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
and to read as follows:

4	"§352D- Vocational training programs; commercial
5	enterprise; revolving fund; operations. (a) There is
6	established the office of youth services revolving fund to be
7	administered by the office. All moneys collected from the sale
8	of goods and services by individual vocational programs that
9	engage in commercial enterprise, as established under section
10	352D-4(5), shall be deposited into the office of youth services
11	revolving fund. The moneys in the revolving fund shall be used
12	for the purposes of vocational programs within the office as
13	determined by the office.
14	(b) The administrators for each individual vocational
15	program, except those at a youth correctional facility, shall
16	determine the prices at which all goods and services are sold.

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1	The prices shall be as near to the prevailing market prices for
2	similar goods and services as practicable.
3	(c) The vocational programs may market goods and services
4	to both the public and private sectors.
5	(d) The administrator for each individual vocational
6	program shall ensure that the quality of goods and services
7	produced is comparable to similar goods and services available
8	from the private sector. For sales to the State or the
9	counties, the quality of the goods or services shall be
10	consistent with the specifications for the goods or services
11	requested."
12	SECTION 2. Section 352D-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
13	amended to read as follows:
14	"§352D-4 Establishment; purpose. There is established
15	within the department of human services for administrative
16	purposes only the office of youth services. The office of youth
17	services is established to provide services and programs for
18	youth at risk under one umbrella agency in order to facilitate
19	optimum service delivery, to prevent delinquency, and to reduce
20	the incidence of recidivism among juveniles through the
21	provision of prevention, rehabilitation, and treatment services.

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1	The offic	e shall also be responsible for program planning and			
2	development, intake/assessment, oversight, as well as				
3	consultation, technical assistance, and staff training relating				
4	to the delivery of services.				
5	The	office shall provide a continuum of services as			
6	follows:				
7	(1)	An integrated intake/assessment and case management			
8		system;			
9	(2)	The necessary educational, vocational, social			
10		counseling and mental health services; provided that			
11		the department of education shall be the only provider			
12		of standards-based education services for all youth			
13		adults at risk and young adults identified with			
14		special education needs or actively receiving special			
15		education services, in accordance with the Individuals			
16		with Disabilities Education Act (20 U.S.C. section			
17		1400 et seq.) and all applicable federal and state			
18		educational requirements;			
19	(3)	Community-based shelter and residential facilities;			
20	(4)	Oversight of youth services; and			

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1	(5)	Other programs [which] that encourage the development
2		of positive self-images and useful skills in [such]
3		youth[-] and young adults, including commercial
4		enterprise vocational programs for young adults. The
5		individuals who may participate in the commercial
6		enterprise vocational programs under this paragraph
7		shall be limited to non-adjudicated at-risk persons
8		between eighteen to twenty-four years of age who are
9		receiving assistance from the office of youth
10		services. For the purposes of this paragraph:
11		"Commercial enterprise" means a for-profit
12		activity of providing goods and services.
13		"Youth" means people ages fourteen to seventeen
14		years.
15	The	executive director of the office of youth services
16	shall sub	mit annual reports to the legislature no later than
17	twenty day	ys prior to the convening of each regular session,
18	reporting	the services or programs funded pursuant to this
19	section,	the number of youth served by each service or program,
20	and the r	esults of the services or programs funded.

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1 To this end, on July 1, 1991, this office shall assume the 2 responsibilities for juvenile corrections functions, which were 3 temporarily placed in the department of corrections pursuant to Act 338 of 1987. These functions shall include, but not be 4 5 limited to, all responsibilities, under chapter 352, for the Hawaii youth correctional facilities." 6 7 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general 8 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$50,000 or so much 9 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2019-2020 and the 10 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 11 2020-2021 to be deposited into the office of youth services 12 revolving fund. 13 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the office of 14 youth services revolving fund the sum of \$50,000 or so much 15 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2019-2020 and the 16 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2020-2021 to carry out the purposes of this Act. 17 18 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the office of 19 youth services for the purposes of this Act. 20 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed

and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.



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SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050;
provided that sections 3 and 4 of this Act shall take effect on
July 1, 2050.
