A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FIREWORKS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 132D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated		
3	and to read as follows:		
4	"§132D- Disposal of confiscated fireworks. A law		
5	enforcement agency that confiscates fireworks pursuant to		
6	enforcement of this chapter may safely destroy or dispose of the		
7	confiscated fireworks; provided that the law enforcement agency		
8	shall retain a sample of each type of confiscated fireworks for		
9	evidentiary purposes."		
10	SECTION 2. Section 132D-14, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
11	amended to read as follows:		
12	"§132D-14 Penalty. (a) Any person:		
13	(1) Importing aerial devices, display fireworks, or		
14	articles pyrotechnic without having a valid license		
15	under section 132D-7 shall be guilty of a class C		
16	felony;

16	(3)	Who transfers or sells aerial devices, display
17		fireworks, or articles pyrotechnic to a person who
18		does not have a valid permit under sections 132D-10
19		and 132D-16, shall be guilty of a class C felony; and
20	(4)	Who removes or extracts the pyrotechnic contents from
21		any fireworks or articles nyrotechnic and uses the

1		contents to construct fireworks, articles pyrotechnic,	
2		or a fireworks or articles pyrotechnic related device	
3		shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.	
4	(b)	Except as provided in subsection (a) or as otherwise	
5	specifica	lly provided for in this chapter, any person violating	
6	any other	provision of this chapter, shall be fined not more	
7	than \$2,0	00 for each violation[-]; provided that:	
8	(1)	The court may establish a fine structure that allows	
9		for increased penalties based on the quantity of	
10		fireworks confiscated; and	
11	(2)	The court may impose a conditional disposal fine to	
12		reimburse the county in which the fireworks were	
13		confiscated for the costs associated with safe	
14		disposal of the confiscated fireworks.	
15	(c)	The court shall collect the fines imposed in	
16	subsection	ns (a) and (b) for violating this chapter and, of the	
17	fines col	lected[$_{7}$]. other than those imposed pursuant to	
18	subsection	n (b)(2), shall pay twenty per cent to the State and	
19	eighty per cent to the county in which the fine was imposed		
20	which sha	ll be expended by the county for law enforcement

- (e) For the purposes of this section, each type of

- 8 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 9 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 10 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2019-2020 and
- 11 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
- 12 year 2020-2021 as a grant to the Honolulu police department to
- 13 procure a secure container to store confiscated fireworks.
- 14 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 15 of public safety for the purposes of this Act.
- 16 SECTION 4. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 17 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 18 begun before its effective date.
- 19 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 20 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

Report Title:

Fireworks; Disposal; Fines; Separate Offenses; Honolulu Police Department; Appropriation

Description:

Allows law enforcement agencies to safely dispose of confiscated fireworks except for a sample that is retained for evidentiary purposes. Authorizes the court to establish a step-up fine based on the amount of fireworks confiscated and to impose a disposal fine to reimburse law enforcement agencies for the costs of safely disposing of confiscated fireworks. Establishes that each type of fireworks unlawfully imported, purchased, possessed, ignited, or discharged constitutes a separate offense. Appropriates funds as a grant to the Honolulu Police Department for a secure container in which to store confiscated fireworks.
