A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SELECTIVE SERVICE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature recognizes that sufficient
- 2 strength in armed forces must be achieved and maintained to
- 3 ensure the security of the United States. In a free society,
- 4 the obligations and privileges of serving in the armed forces
- 5 and the reserve components should be shared in accordance with a
- 6 system of selection that is fair and just, and consistent with
- 7 maintaining an effective national economy.
- 8 The legislature finds that to achieve these national
- 9 security goals, Congress enacted the United States Military
- 10 Selective Service Act, title 50 United States Code section 3801,
- 11 which requires all male citizens and males residing in the
- 12 United States, except for lawfully admitted non-immigrants, to
- 13 register with the Selective Service System upon reaching the age
- 14 of eighteen.
- 15 The legislature further finds that any person who is not in
- 16 compliance with the Military Selective Service Act is ineligible

- 1 for federal student financial assistance and employment within
- 2 the executive branch of the federal government.
- 3 The purpose of this Act is to require compliance with the
- 4 Military Selective Service Act to be eligible for enrollment in
- 5 a state-supported post-secondary educational institution or
- 6 qualify for state financial assistance for post-secondary
- 7 education, or to be eligible for state or county employment or
- 8 service.
- 9 SECTION 2. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by
- 10 adding a new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read
- 11 as follows:

- 13 SELECTIVE SERVICE REGISTRATION AWARENESS AND COMPLIANCE ACT
- 14 § -1 Short title. This chapter shall be known as the
- 15 "Selective Service Registration Awareness and Compliance Act".

- 17 "Military Selective Service Act" means title 50 United
- 18 States Code section 3801 et seq.
- 19 § -3 Compliance; post-secondary education enrollment and

- 13 (2) Serving in the armed forces of the United States on
 14 active duty, other than in a reserve or National Guard
 15 unit, or has already served in the armed forces or has
 16 a condition that would preclude acceptability for
 17 military service;
- 18 (3) Neither a United States citizen nor a resident19 immigrant;
- 20 (4) A permanent resident of the Trust Territory of the
 21 Pacific Islands or the Northern Mariana Islands; or

8	§ -6 Severability. If any provision of this chapter, or
9	the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held
10	invalid, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or
11	applications of the chapter which can be given without the
12	invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions
13	of this chapter are severable."
14	SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050;
15	provided that section 2 shall take effect on January 1 following
16	the enactment of federal law that expands the requirement that
17	certain male individuals register with the United States
18	Selective Service to also include female individuals.
