# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SELECTIVE SERVICE.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature recognizes that sufficient
strength in armed forces must be achieved and maintained to
ensure the security of the United States. In a free society,
the obligations and privileges of serving in the armed forces
and the reserve components should be shared in accordance with a
system of selection that is fair and just, and consistent with
maintaining an effective national economy.

8 The legislature finds that to achieve these national 9 security goals, Congress enacted the United States Military 10 Selective Service Act, title 50 United States Code section 3801, 11 which requires all male citizens and males residing in the 12 United States, except for lawfully admitted non-immigrants, to 13 register with the Selective Service System upon reaching the age 14 of eighteen.

15 The legislature further finds that any person who is not in 16 compliance with the Military Selective Service Act is ineligible



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1 for federal student financial assistance and employment within 2 the executive branch of the federal government. 3 The purpose of this Act is to require compliance with the 4 Military Selective Service Act to be eligible for enrollment in 5 a state-supported post-secondary educational institution or 6 qualify for state financial assistance for post-secondary 7 education, or to be eligible for state or county employment or 8 service. 9 SECTION 2. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by 10 adding a new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read 11 as follows: 12 "CHAPTER 13 SELECTIVE SERVICE REGISTRATION AWARENESS AND COMPLIANCE ACT 14 S -1 Short title. This chapter shall be known as the 15 "Selective Service Registration Awareness and Compliance Act". 16 -2 Definitions. As used in this chapter: S 17 "Military Selective Service Act" means title 50 United 18 States Code section 3801 et seq. 19 -3 Compliance; post-secondary education enrollment and S. 20 financial assistance. (a) Notwithstanding any law to the



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1 contrary, any person who is not in compliance with the Military 2 Selective Service Act shall not be: 3 (1) Permitted to enroll in, or receive education from, a 4 state-supported post-secondary educational 5 institution, including a university, college, 6 community college, professional school, research 7 facility, education center, or institution within the 8 University of Hawaii system; and 9 Eligible to receive a loan, grant, scholarship, or (2) 10 other financial assistance for post-secondary 11 education that is provided, supported, or guaranteed 12 by the State. 13 The University of Hawaii shall ensure that applicants (b) 14 and enrollees under its jurisdiction comply with the Military 15 Selective Service Act for the purposes of this section. 16 S -4 Compliance; state and county employment and 17 service. (a) Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, any 18 person who is not in compliance with the Military Selective 19 Service Act shall not be eligible for: 20 (1) Employment by the State or any of its political 21 subdivisions; and

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1 Excused from registration for some other reason (5) provided by the Military Selective Service Act; 2 provided that the individual claiming an exception 3 4 pursuant to this paragraph shall provide a written statement to the entity with which the individual is 5 6 claiming an exception describing the exception claimed. 7 8 S -6 Severability. If any provision of this chapter, or 9 the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or 10 11 applications of the chapter which can be given without the 12 invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions 13 of this chapter are severable." 14 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
