A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE WEED AND SEED STRATEGY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the weed and seed
- 2 strategy is a United States Department of Justice initiative
- 3 that is administered locally by the United States Attorney's
- 4 Office.
- 5 The weed and seed strategy is a collaborative effort among
- 6 federal, state, and county law enforcement agencies, social
- 7 service agencies, private businesses, nonprofit organizations,
- 8 and residents to reclaim, restore, and rebuild communities. The
- 9 four key elements of the weed and seed strategy are:
- 10 (1) Law enforcement;
- 11 (2) Community policing;
- 12 (3) Prevention, intervention, and treatment programs; and
- 13 (4) Neighborhood restoration.
- 14 The weed and seed strategy uses local law enforcement to
- 15 prevent, control, and reduce violent crime, drug abuse, and gang
- 16 activity in targeted neighborhoods by "weeding" out the criminal
- 17 element in the community. Community policing involves having

- 1 police officers work closely with community residents to develop
- 2 solutions to violent and drug-related crimes. The next step is
- 3 to "seed" the community with human services that include
- 4 prevention, intervention, treatment, and neighborhood
- 5 revitalization.
- 6 The legislature finds that the weed and seed program has
- 7 been successful since its inception in the Kalihi-Palama and
- 8 Chinatown areas of downtown Honolulu as well as in Waipahu, Ewa,
- 9 and Ewa Beach. The legislature also finds that crime in these
- 10 areas has been significantly reduced since the inception of the
- 11 program.
- 12 The purpose of this Act is to make an appropriation to
- 13 maintain the weed and seed strategy.
- 14 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 15 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$400,000 or so much
- 16 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2019-2020 and the
- 17 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
- 18 2020-2021 for a grant pursuant to chapter 42F, Hawaii Revised
- 19 Statutes, to Weed and Seed Hawaii to maintain the weed and seed
- 20 program.

- 1 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 2 of the attorney general for the purposes of this Act.
- 3 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2019.
