A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HOUSING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Hawaii has the
- highest per capita rate of homelessness of any state in the 2
- nation. Hawaii also has the highest rate of chronically 3
- unsheltered homeless per capita of any state. An estimated 4
- 5 6,530 people are living on the streets and in shelters in
- 6 Hawaii. Addressing homelessness requires a multi-faceted
- 7 approach using interventions that are targeted to the particular
- 8 characteristics of the population being served. The state rent
- 9 supplement for homeless families and individuals is critically
- 10 necessary to address homelessness.
- The state rent supplement program provides a "shallow", but 11
- sustained, subsidy to struggling households. Unlike the "deep" 12
- 13 subsidy Housing Choice Voucher program, better known as the
- 14 Section 8 program, which helps families at the lowest ends of
- the income scale by bridging a wide affordability gap between 15
- 16 income and housing costs, the state rent supplement program
- helps households who are closer to financial self-sufficiency 17



- 1 but still have a narrow affordability gap to fill. The state
- 2 rent supplement program provides an ongoing subsidy, enabling
- 3 homeless households or those at imminent risk of homelessness to
- 4 close the affordability gap, maintain housing, and achieve self-
- 5 sufficiency.
- 6 Because individual subsidies under state rent supplement
- 7 programs are relatively low, the programs can resolve
- 8 homelessness for a large number of individuals and families
- 9 relative to the total cost of the subsidy program.
- 10 The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds to support
- 11 the state rent supplement program.
- 12 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 13 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$2,500,000 or so much
- 14 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2019-2020 and the
- 15 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
- 16 2020-2021 for the state rent supplement program established
- 17 pursuant to section 356D-151, Hawaii Revised Statutes.
- 18 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the Hawaii
- 19 public housing authority for the purposes of this Act.
- 20 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
