A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PHARMACY BENEFIT MANAGERS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to increase
2	transparency and promote, preserve, and protect the public
3	health, safety, and welfare by:
4	(1) Providing that a pharmacy benefit manager may not
5	prohibit a pharmacist or pharmacy from providing an
6	insured individual with information on the amount of
7	the insured's cost share for a prescription drug and
8	the clinical efficacy of a more affordable alternative
9	drug if one is available; and
10	(2) Preventing penalization of a pharmacy or pharmacist
11	for sharing such information.
12	SECTION 2. Chapter 431S, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
13	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated

14 and to read as follows:

15 "<u>§4315-</u> <u>Gag clause prohibited.</u> A pharmacy benefit 16 <u>manager may not prohibit a pharmacist or pharmacy from providing</u> 17 an insured individual with information on the amount of the

1	insured's cost share for the insured's prescription drug and the
2	clinical efficacy of a more affordable alternative drug if one
3	is available. Neither a pharmacy nor a pharmacist shall be
4	penalized by a pharmacy benefit manager for disclosing such
5	information to an insured or for selling to an insured a more
6	affordable alternative if one is available."
7	SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
8	matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
9	begun before its effective date.
10	SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.
11	SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
