BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. (a) The state parks division of the department

4	trails to	assist hikers and reduce the need for rescues of

7	(1)	Include an analysis of potential benefits to the State
8		from employing residential caretakers at high-use
9		trail locations, including whether incidents that lead
10		to the need for rescues of hikers would likely be
11		prevented by residential caretakers;
12	(2)	Provide cost projections for housing, compensation,
13		and benefits for residential caretakers;

15		caretakers would be the most effective in reducing the

1	(4) Take into consideration the National Fair Bervice s		
2	model for a resident workforce.		
3	(c) The state parks division of the department of land and		
4	natural resources shall submit a report of its findings and		
5	recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the		
6	legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of		
7	the regular session of 2020.		
8	SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general		
9	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so		
10	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2019-2020 for		
11	the state parks division of the department of land and natural		
12	resources to conduct the feasibility study of a state parks		
13	residential caretakers program.		
14	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of		
15	land and natural resources for the purposes of this Act.		
16	SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on December 31,		
17	2050.
