A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTI	ON 1. The legislature finds that every woman who
2	chooses to	give birth or considers giving birth in Hawaii has
3	the right	to access information on the birthing process, to make
4	informed d	lecisions about her birthing plan, to express her
5	choices an	d preference, and to choose her care provider. As
6	part of he	er rights, a woman may choose to seek practitioners of
7	the midwif	e model of care for care and treatment before, during,
8	and after her pregnancy.	
9	The m	nidwife model of care is based on treating pregnancy
10	and childb	oirth as normal life events and encourages hands-on
11	care before, during, and after pregnancy. The midwife model of	
12	care includes:	
13	(1)	Monitoring the physical, psychological, and social
14		well-being of the woman throughout the childbearing
15		cycle;
16	(2)	Providing the woman with individualized education,
17		counseling, and prenatal care; continuous hands-on

1		assistance during labor and delivery; and postpartum
2		support;
3	(3)	Minimizing technological interventions; and
4	(4)	Identifying and referring women who require
5		obstetrical attention.
6	The	purpose of this Act is to ensure women have access to
7	both info	rmation about the practice of midwifery, including
8	practices	that protect or promote traditional native Hawaiian
9	and other	indigenous or cultural birth practices, and birth
10	practitio	oners who follow the midwife model of care.
11	SECT	TION 2. Chapter 321, part XXV, Hawaii Revised Statutes
12	is amende	d by adding a new section to be appropriately
13	designate	ed and to read as follows:
14	" <u>§32</u>	1- Midwifery. (a) Consumers shall have access to
15	multiple	routes of midwifery care and midwifery pathways to
16	allow the	em to choose a birth plan and birth practitioner that
17	supports	their cultural or religious beliefs.
18	(b)	Traditional native Hawaiian and other indigenous or
19	cultural	beliefs and practices may be exercised to the fullest
20	extent al	lowed under applicable federal law.

2	chapter, birth practitioners shall ensure consumer access to all
}	pertinent birth education information and materials. Such

5	form and manner to ensure the consumer is able to comprehend
	what is being communicated to them."
