A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TRAFFIC CONTROL.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 291C-32, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended to read as follows:

3 "§291C-32 Traffic-control signal legend. (a) Whenever 4 traffic is controlled by traffic-control signals exhibiting 5 different colored lights, or colored lighted arrows, 6 successively one at a time or in combination, only the colors 7 green, red, and yellow shall be used, except for special 8 pedestrian signals carrying a word or symbol legend, and the 9 lights shall indicate and apply to drivers of vehicles and 10 pedestrians as follows:

11 (1) Green indication:

12 (A) Vehicular traffic facing a circular green signal
13 may proceed straight through or turn right or
14 left unless a sign at the place prohibits either
15 [such] turn. But vehicular traffic, including
16 vehicles turning right or left, shall yield the
17 right-of-way to other vehicles and to pedestrians



1			lawfully within the intersection or an adjacent
2			crosswalk at the time [such] <u>the</u> signal is
3			exhibited.
4		(B)	Vehicular traffic facing a green arrow signal,
5			shown alone or in combination with another
6			indication, may cautiously enter the intersection
7			only to make the movement indicated by [such] <u>the</u>
8			arrow, or [such] <u>any</u> other movement [as is]
9			permitted by other indications shown at the same
10			time. [Such] <u>This</u> vehicular traffic shall yield
11			the right-of-way to pedestrians lawfully within
12			an adjacent crosswalk and to other traffic
13			lawfully using the intersection.
14		(C)	Unless otherwise directed by a pedestrian-control
15			signal, as provided in section 291C-33,
16			pedestrians facing any green signal, except when
17			the sole green signal is a turn arrow, may
18			proceed across the roadway within any marked or
19			unmarked crosswalk.
20	(2)	Stea	dy yellow indication:



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1 (A) Vehicular traffic facing a steady yellow signal
2 is thereby warned that the related green movement
3 is being terminated or that a red indication will
4 be exhibited immediately thereafter when
5 vehicular traffic shall not enter the
6 intersection.

- 7 (B) Pedestrians facing a steady yellow signal, unless
 8 otherwise directed by a pedestrian-control signal
 9 as provided in section 291C-33, are thereby
 10 advised that there is insufficient time to cross
 11 the roadway before a red indication is shown and
 12 no pedestrian shall then start to cross the
 13 roadway.
- 14 (3) Steady red indication:

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(A) Vehicular traffic facing a steady red signal
alone shall stop at a clearly marked stop line,
but if none, before entering the crosswalk on the
near side of the intersection or, if none, then
before entering the intersection and shall remain
standing until an indication to proceed is shown,



except as provided in the next succeeding 1 paragraphs. 2 The driver of a vehicle [which] that is stopped 3 (B) in obedience to a steady red indication may make 4 a right turn but shall yield the right-of-way to 5 pedestrians and other traffic proceeding as 6 7 directed by the signal at [said] the intersection, except that [counties]: 8 9 (i) Counties by ordinance may prohibit any [such] right turn against a steady red 10 indication, [which] provided that the 11 ordinance shall be effective when a sign 12 13 giving notice is erected at [such] that 14 intersection [giving notice thereof.]; and Notwithstanding clause (i), a right turn 15 (ii) 16 against a steady red indication shall be prohibited in a county with a population 17 18 greater than five hundred thousand. The driver of a vehicle on a one-way street which 19 (C) 20 intersects another one-way street on which 21 traffic moves to the left shall stop in obedience



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1	to a steady red indication but may then make a
2	left turn into said one-way street, but shall
3	yield right-of-way to pedestrians, proceeding as
4	directed by the signal at [said] the intersection
5	except that [counties]:
6	(i) Counties by ordinance may prohibit any
7	[such] left turn as [above] described
8	[which] in this subsection, provided that
9	the ordinance shall be effective when a sign
10	giving notice is erected at [such] that
11	intersection [giving notice thereof.]; and
12	(ii) A left turn against a steady red indication
13	shall be prohibited in a county with a
14	population greater than five hundred
15	thousand.
16	(D) Unless otherwise directed by a pedestrian-control
17	signal as provided in section 291C-33,
18	pedestrians facing a steady red signal alone
19	shall not enter the roadway.
20	(b) [In the event] <u>If</u> an official traffic-control signal
21	is erected and maintained at a place other than an intersection,



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the provisions of this section shall be applicable except [as 1 2 to] those provisions which by their nature can have no application. Any stop required shall be made at a sign or 3 marking on the pavement indicating where the stop shall be made, 4 5 but in the absence of any [such] sign or marking the stop shall 6 be made at the signal."

7 SECTION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that 8 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were 9 begun before its effective date.

10 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 11 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

12 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
