A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO RANKED CHOICE VOTING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 11, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
2	by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to
3	read as follows:
4	" <u>§11-</u> Ranked choice voting; application; procedure.
5	(a) Any federal election not held on the date of a regularly
6	scheduled primary election or general election and any special
7	election for a vacant seat on a county council shall be
8	conducted by ranked choice voting.
9	(b) Except as provided in subsections (c) and (d), the
10	following procedures shall be used to determine the winner of an
11	election conducted by ranked choice voting:
12	(1) Tabulation of votes shall proceed in rounds;
13	(2) In each round, the number of votes for each continuing
14	candidate shall be counted, with each continuing
15	ballot counting as one vote for its highest-ranked
16	continuing candidate for that round;

1	<u>(3)</u>	Inactive ballots shall not be counted for any
2		continuing candidate; and
3	(4)	The round shall end with one of two potential
4		outcomes:
5		(A) If there are two or fewer continuing candidates,
6		the candidate receiving the most votes shall be
7		declared the winner of the election; or
8		(B) If there are more than two continuing candidates
9		the last-place candidate shall be defeated and a
10		new round begins.
11	<u>(c)</u>	A tie under this section between candidates for the
12	most votes	s in the final round or a tie between last-place
13	candidates	s in any round shall be decided by lot, and the
14	candidate	chosen by lot shall be defeated.
15	(d)	The office of elections may modify a ranked-choice
16	voting ba	llot and tabulation; provided that:
17	(1)	The number of allowable rankings may be limited to no
18		fewer than six; and
19	(2)	Two or more candidates may be defeated simultaneously
20		by batch elimination in any round of tabulation.

1 (e) The office of elections shall conduct voter education 2 on ranked choice voting before any election in which ranked 3 choice voting will be used. The office of elections may work 4 with community partners and non-profit entities to enhance 5 educational outreach. 6 (f) As used in this section: 7 "Batch elimination" means the simultaneous defeat of 8 multiple candidates for whom it is mathematically impossible to 9 be elected. 10 "Continuing ballot" means a ballot that is not an inactive 11 ballot. 12 "Highest continuing ranking" means the highest ranking on a 13 voter's ballot for a continuing candidate. 14 "Inactive ballot" means a ballot that does not rank any 15 continuing candidate, contains an overvote at the highest 16 continuing ranking, or contains two or more sequential skipped 17 rankings before its highest continuing ranking. 18 "Last-place candidate" means the candidate receiving the 19 fewest votes in a round of ranked-choice voting tabulation. 20 "Mathematically impossible to be elected", with respect to

a candidate, means that the candidate:

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1	(1)	Cannot be elected because the candidate's vote total
2		in a round of the ranked-choice voting tabulation plus
3		all votes that could possibly be transferred to the
4		candidate in future rounds from candidates receiving
5		fewer votes or an equal number of votes would not be
6		enough to surpass the candidate receiving the next-
7		higher vote total in the round; or
8	(2)	Has a lower vote total than a candidate described in
9		paragraph (1).
10	"Ove	rvote" means a circumstance in which a voter has ranked
11	more than	one candidate at the same ranking.
12	"Ran	ked choice voting" means the method of casting and
13	tabulatin	g votes in which voters rank candidates in order of
14	preferenc	e, tabulation proceeds in sequential rounds in which
15	last-plac	e candidates are defeated, and the candidate receiving
16	the most	votes in the final round is elected.
17	<u>"Ran</u>	king" means the number assigned on a ballot by a voter
18	to a cand	idate to express the voter's preference for that
19	candidate	, in which number one is the highest ranking, number
20	two is th	e next-highest ranking, and so on.

1 "Round" means an instance of the sequence of voting 2 tabulation steps established in subsection (b). 3 "Skipped ranking" means a circumstance in which a voter has left a ranking blank and ranks a candidate at a subsequent 4 5 ranking." 6 SECTION 2. Section 11-91, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 7 amended to read as follows: 8 "\$11-91 Proclamation. Not later than 4:30 p.m. on the 9 tenth day [prior to] before the close of filing in elections involving state offices, or federal elections to be conducted by 10 ranked choice voting pursuant to section 11- , the chief 11 12 election officer shall issue an election proclamation. In 13 elections involving only county offices the clerk shall issue 14 the proclamation. In elections involving both state and county 15 offices the proclamation may be issued jointly. 16 The proclamation shall contain a statement of the time and 17 places where, and the purposes for which, the election is to be 18 held, and a designation of the offices and the terms thereof for which candidates are to be nominated or elected. It may also 19 20 contain any other relevant matter, including an offer of 21 rewards, for the detection and conviction of offenders against

- 1 the election laws. If the election is to be conducted by ranked
- 2 choice voting pursuant to section 11- , the proclamation shall
- 3 state that votes shall be cast and tabulated using ranked choice
- 4 voting and shall provide an explanation of how ranked choice
- 5 votes are tabulated. The chief election officer or clerk shall
- 6 cause the election proclamation to be published at least once in
- 7 a newspaper of general circulation and not later than on the
- 8 tenth day [prior to] before the close of filing."
- 9 SECTION 3. Section 11-112, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 10 amended to read as follows:
- "§11-112 Contents of ballot. (a) The ballot shall
- 12 contain the names of the candidates, their party affiliation or
- 13 nonpartisanship in partisan election contests, the offices for
- 14 which they are running, and the district in which the election
- 15 is being held. In multimember races the ballot shall state that
- 16 the voter shall not vote for more than the number of seats
- 17 available or the number of candidates listed where [such] the
- 18 number of candidates is [less] fewer than the number of seats
- 19 available.

- 1 (b) The ballot may include questions concerning proposed
- 2 state constitutional amendments, proposed county charter
- 3 amendments, or proposed initiative or referendum issues.
- 4 (c) At the chief election officer's discretion, the ballot
- 5 may have a background design imprinted onto it.
- 6 (d) When the electronic voting system is used, the ballot
- 7 may have pre-punched codes and printed information which
- 8 identify the voting districts, precincts, and ballot sets to
- 9 facilitate the electronic data processing of these ballots.
- 10 (e) The name of the candidate may be printed with the
- 11 Hawaiian or English equivalent or nickname, if the candidate so
- 12 requests in writing at the time the candidate's nomination
- 13 papers are filed. Candidates' names, including the Hawaiian or
- 14 English equivalent or nickname, shall be set on one line.
- 15 (f) The ballot shall bear no word, motto, device, sign, or
- 16 symbol other than as allowed in this title.
- 17 (g) The ballot may include information necessary to
- 18 conduct ranked choice voting pursuant to section 11- ."
- 19 SECTION 4. Section 11-151, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 20 amended to read as follows:

1	"§11	-151 Vote count. [Each] Except for contests conducted
2	by ranked	choice voting pursuant to section 11- , each contest
3	or questi	on on a ballot shall be counted independently as
4	follows:	
5	(1)	If the votes cast in a contest or on a question are
6		equal to or less than the number to be elected or
7		chosen for that contest or question, the votes for
8		that contest or question shall be counted;
9	(2)	If the votes cast in a contest or on a question exceed
10		the number to be elected or chosen for that contest or
11		question, the votes for that contest or question shall
12		not be counted; and
13	(3)	If a contest or question requires a majority of the
14		votes for passage, any blank, spoiled, or invalid
15		ballot shall not be tallied for passage or as votes
16		cast except that such ballots shall be counted as
17		votes cast in ratification of a constitutional
18		amendment or a question for a constitutional
19		convention."
20	SECT	ION 5. Section 11-152, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
21	amended t	o read as follows:

1 "\$11-152 Method of counting. (a) For votes cast using 2 the electronic voting system, the ballots shall be taken in the sealed ballot containers to the counting center according to the 3 4 procedure and schedule adopted by the chief election officer to 5 promote the security of the ballots. For all votes cast in an 6 election, in the presence of official observers, counting center 7 employees may start to count the ballots before election day, as 8 specified in section 11-108. 9 (b) In an election conducted by ranked choice voting, 10 votes shall be counted pursuant to section 11- ." 11 SECTION 6. Section 11-155, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 12 amended to read as follows: "\$11-155 Certification of results of election. On receipt 13 14 of certified tabulations from the election officials concerned, 15 the chief election officer, or county clerk in a county 16 election, shall compile, certify, and release the election 17 results after the expiration of the time for bringing an 18 election contest. The certification shall be based on a 19 comparison and reconciliation of the following: 20 (1) The results of the canvass of ballots conducted

pursuant to chapter 16;

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1	(2)	The audit of pollbooks (and related record books) and
2		resultant overage and underage report;
3	(3)	The audit results of the manual audit team;
4	(4)	The results of the absentee ballot reconciliation
5		report compiled by the clerks;
6	(5)	The results of any mandatory recount of votes
7		conducted pursuant to section 11-158; and
8	(6)	All logs, tally sheets, and other documents generated
9		during the election and in the canvass of the election
10		results.
11	A certifi	cate of election or a certificate of results declaring
12	the resul	ts of the election as of election day shall be issued
13	pursuant	to section 11-156; provided that in the event of an
14	overage o	r underage, a list of all precincts in which an overage
15	or undera	ge occurred shall be attached to the certificate. The
16	[number o	f) candidates to be elected [receiving the highest
17	number of	who receive the most votes in any election district
18	shall be	declared to be elected $[+]$; provided that candidates for
19	offices e	lected by ranked choice voting shall be declared to be
20	elected p	ursuant to section 11 Unless otherwise provided,
21	the term	of office shall begin or end as of the close of polls

- 1 on election day. The position on the question receiving the
- 2 appropriate majority of the votes cast shall be reflected in a
- 3 certificate of results issued pursuant to section 11-156."
- 4 SECTION 7. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 5 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 6 SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
