A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO VOTER REGISTRATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to conform the voter
- 2 registration deadline provision with Hawai'i's vote by mail
- 3 statutes by extending the voter registration deadline from
- 4 thirty days to fifteen days prior to each election.
- 5 SECTION 2. Section 11-15.2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 "§11-15.2 [Late registration.] Same day in-person
- 8 registration. (a) Notwithstanding the closing of the general
- 9 county register pursuant to section 11-24, a person who is
- 10 [eligible to vote but is] not registered to vote may register by
- 11 appearing in person at any voter service center on or before
- 12 election day.
- (b) The clerk shall designate a registration clerk [, who
- 14 may be an election official, at each voter service center [-
- 15 (c) The registration clerk] who shall process applications
- 16 for any person [not registered to vote] who submits a signed

2	a sworn a	ffirmation:
3	(1)	Of the person's qualification to vote;
4	(2)	Acknowledging that the person has not voted and will

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         (g) The clerk of each county shall add persons who

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    shall mail to the person a notice including the person's name,
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    current street address, district, and date of registration. A
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    notice mailed pursuant to this subsection shall serve as prima
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    facie evidence that the person is a registered voter as of the

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         SECTION 3. Section 11-24, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
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    amended to read as follows:
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         "§11-24 Closing register. (a) At 4:30 p.m. on the
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    [thirtieth] fifteenth day prior to each [primary, special

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    county register shall be closed to registration and remain

SECTION 4. Section 11-102, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 1 2 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows: 3 To the extent practicable, the clerk shall mail a 4 ballot package by non-forwardable mail to each registered voter 5 in the county so as to enable voters to receive the ballot 6 package approximately eighteen days before the election. The 7 clerk shall continue mailing ballot packages to voters who 8 register to vote no later than fifteen days before the date of 9 the election and to voters who update their voter registration 10 address no later than fourteen days before the date of the 11 election. In determining the initial mailing date of the ballot 12 packages, the clerk shall consider the mailing place of origin 13 and the most recent postal service delivery standards. 14 clerk shall not mail a ballot package to any voter in the county register who is identified as having an outdated or non-15 16 deliverable mailing address. Nothing in this part shall be **17** construed to change the responsibilities of the clerk or chief 18 election officer under chapter 15D with respect to uniform 19 military and overseas voters." 20 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 21 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

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1 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
