A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO LOAN FORGIVENESS FOR EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION PROFESSIONALS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 304A-701, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended as follows:

3 1. By amending subsection (a) to read:

4 "(a) There is created the Hawaii educator loan program to 5 be administered by the University of Hawaii, in partnership with 6 a financial institution whose operations are principally 7 conducted in Hawaii, to provide financial support to students 8 and teachers who complete a state-approved teacher education 9 program and who agree to teach as a full-time teacher for a 10 period of time to be determined by the university prior to the 11 award of a loan, in:

12	(1)	The Hawaii public school system in a hard-to-fill
13		position including special education, regular
14		education shortage categories, or Title 1 schools, and
15		in one of the following capacities:

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1		(A)	As an elementary school teacher teaching in the		
2			field of elementary education who has met		
3			standards as set forth by the Hawaii teacher		
4			standards board; or		
5		(B)	As a secondary school teacher teaching in the		
6			subject area that is relevant to the loan		
7			recipient's academic major as certified by the		
8			department of education who has met standards as		
9			set forth by the Hawaii teacher standards board;		
10			[or]		
11	(2)	At a	school located in a rural area in the State, as		
12		dete	rmined by the superintendent of education[\pm]; or		
13	(3)	<u>At a</u>	n early childhood education center or facility, as		
14		dete	rmined by the director of human services.		
15	Eligibili	ty sh	all be determined by the university on a		
16	competiti	ve ba	sis. The amount to be loaned to a student shall		
17	be determ	ined (oy the board of regents based on need for		
18	financial aid and proof of acceptance into a state-approved				
19	teacher education program at the university. The maximum amount				
20	of loans	that	a student may receive under this program shall be		
21	an aggreg	rate a	mount equivalent to tuition payments and costs of

3	2. By amending subsections (e) and (f) to read:				
4	"(e) Upon a showing of proof that the loan recipient has				
5	completed a state-approved teacher education program and for				
6	each year that the loan award recipient teaches in the Hawaii				
7	public school system pursuant to subsection (a)(1) or (2)[$_{ au}$] or				
8	in an early childhood education center or facility pursuant to				
9	subsection (a)(3), loan forgiveness shall be provided to the				
10	recipient as follows:				
11	(1) [Ten] <u>Fifteen</u> per cent of the total amount of the loan				
12	award and interest shall be waived every year for the				
13	first [five] three years of repayment; and				
14	(2) [Twenty-five] <u>Twenty-seven and one-half</u> per cent of				
15	the total amount of the loan award and interest shall				
16	be waived every year for the [sixth] <u>fourth</u> and				
17	[seventh] fifth years of repayment.				
18	(f) If a loan recipient who is a graduate of a state-				
19	approved teacher education program subject to this section and				
20	teaching pursuant to subsection (a) fails to teach in the Hawaii				
21	public school system or early childhood education center or				

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1 facility for the minimum number of years, as determined by the 2 university prior to the loan, from the recipient's original date 3 of employment with the department of education $[_{7}]$ or early childhood education center or facility, excluding temporary 4 5 leaves of absence, then the recipient shall repay any remaining 6 loan balance at the rate of ten per cent simple interest." 7 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general 8 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so 9 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2020-2021 for 10 loan forgiveness for early childhood education professionals. 11 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the University of 12 Hawaii for the purposes of this Act. 13 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 14 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. 15 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2020.
