A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SINGLE-USE PLASTICS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 342G, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
 2 amended by adding a new part to be appropriately designated and
- 3 to read as follows:
- 4 "PART . SINGLE USE PLASTICS
- 5 §342G-A Definitions. As used in this part:
- 6 "Business" means any commercial enterprise or establishment
- 7 operating in the State, including an individual proprietorship,
- 8 joint venture, partnership, corporation, limited liability
- 9 company, or other legal entity, whether for profit or not for
- 10 profit, and includes all employees of the business or any
- 11 independent contractors associated with the business.
- "Compostable plastic bag" means a checkout bag that is
- 13 provided to a customer for purposes of transporting groceries or
- 14 other retail goods, that meets current ASTM D6400 standard
- 15 specifications for compostable plastics and that is labeled
- 16 with:



1	(1) The biodegradable product institute (BPI) logo as		
2	meeting the ASTM standard for compostability; and		
3	(2) "Compostable" on both sides of the bag in either green		
4	color lettering that is at least one inch in height,		
5	or as otherwise specified; or within a green color		
6	band that is at least one inch in height in order to		
7	be readily and easily identifiable.		
8	"Customer" means a person who purchases merchandise from a		
9	business.		
10	"Mil" means one thousandth of one inch.		
11	"Non-recyclable paper bag" means a paper bag that is not a		
12	recyclable paper bag.		
13	"Plastic checkout bag" means a carryout bag that is		
14	provided by a business to a customer for purposes of		
15	transporting groceries or other retail goods, is made from		
16	plastic, and is not specifically designed and manufactured for		
17	multiple reuse, except:		
18	(1) Bags used by customers inside a business to package		
19	loose items including fruits, vegetables, nuts, ground		
20	coffee, grains, candies, or small hardware items;		

1	(2)	Bags used to contain or wrap frozen foods, meat or
2		fish, flowers or potted plants, or other items used to
3		contain dampness;
4	(3)	Bags provided by pharmacists to contain prescription
5		medications;
6	(4)	Newspaper bags for home newspaper delivery;
7	(5)	Door-hanger bags;
8	(6)	Laundry, dry cleaning, or garment bags, including bags
9		provided by hotels to guests to contain wet or dirty
10		clothing;
11	(7)	Bags sold in packages containing multiple bags
12		intended for use as garbage, pet waste, or yard waste
13		bags;
14	(8)	Bags used to contain live animals, including fish or
15		insects sold in pet stores; or
16	(9)	Bags used to transport chemical pesticides, drain-
17		cleaning chemicals, or other caustic chemicals sold at
18		retail; provided that this exemption shall be limited
19		to one bag per customer.

1 "Plastic film bag" means a plastic bag made out of thin 2 flexible sheets of plastic with a thickness of ten mils or less, 3 except: 4 Bags used by customers inside a business to package 5 loose items including fruits, vegetables, nuts, ground 6 coffee, grains, candies, or small hardware items; 7 Bags used to contain or wrap frozen foods, meat or (2) fish, flowers or potted plants, or other items used to 8 9 contain dampness; 10 (3) Bags provided by pharmacists to contain prescription 11 medications; 12 (4) Newspaper bags for home newspaper delivery; 13 (5) Door-hanger bags; 14 (6) Laundry, dry cleaning, or garment bags, including bags 15 provided by hotels to guests to contain wet or dirty 16 clothing; 17 (7) Bags sold in packages containing multiple bags 18 intended for use as garbage, pet waste, or yard waste 19 bags; 20 Bags used to contain live animals, including fish or (8) 21 insects sold in pet stores; or

1 (9) Bags used to transport chemical pesticides, drain-2 cleaning chemicals, or other caustic chemicals sold at 3 retail; provided that this exemption shall be limited 4 to one bag per customer. 5 "Plastic service ware" means single-use plastic straws, 6 stirrers, and utensils. 7 "Recyclable paper bag" means a paper bag that: Is one hundred per cent recyclable; 8 (1)9 (2) Contains a minimum of forty per cent post-consumer 10 recycled content; and 11 (3) Displays the words "reusable" and "recyclable" in a 12 highly visible manner on the exterior of the bag. 13 "Reusable bag" means a bag with handles that is 14 specifically designed and manufactured for multiple reuse and is made of: 15 16 (1)Cloth or other washable fabric; or 17 (2) Durable material suitable for reuse, including plastic 18 that is at least 2.25 mils thick; 19 provided that "reusable bag" does not include plastic film bags. 20 "Single-use" means designed to be used once and discarded 21 and not designed for repeated use and sanitation.

- 1 "Utensils" means single-use plastic implements intended to
- 2 assist in the consumption food, including but not limited to
- 3 spoons, forks, and knives.
- 4 §342G-B Ban on plastic checkout bags and non-recyclable
- 5 paper bags. (a) Except as provided in subsections (b) and (c),
- 6 businesses shall be prohibited from providing plastic checkout
- 7 bags and non-recyclable paper bags to customers at the point of
- 8 sale for purposes of transporting groceries or other
- 9 merchandise.
- 10 (b) Businesses may provide, at the point of sale, reusable
- 11 bags or recyclable paper bags to customers for purposes of
- 12 transporting groceries or other merchandise, provided that the
- 13 customer is charged by the business a minimum of fifteen cents
- 14 per bag. Businesses shall not provide compostable plastic bags
- 15 at the point of sale for the purposes of transporting groceries
- 16 or other merchandise.
- 17 (c) All moneys collected pursuant to subsection (b) shall
- 18 be deposited into the environmental management special fund.
- 19 All interest earned on accrued moneys deposited in the fund
- 20 shall become a part of the fund.

- 1 (d) Nothing in this section shall be interpreted as
- 2 prohibiting businesses from providing non-recyclable paper bags,
- 3 with or without charge, to protect or transport prepared foods,
- 4 beverages, or bakery goods.
- 5 §342G-C Single-use plastics; food vending; food packaging;
- 6 prohibited. (a) Unless otherwise exempted pursuant to section
- 7 339-D, no food vendor in the State shall serve prepared food in
- 8 any polystyrene foam container that is manufactured with the use
- 9 of or containing chlorofluorocarbons. The department may
- 10 require a food vendor, supplier, or distributor to furnish a
- 11 written statement from the manufacturer or supplier of the
- 12 container used by the food vendor, indicating that use of the
- 13 container is not prohibited.
- 14 (b) Unless otherwise exempted pursuant to section 339-D,
- 15 no food vendor shall provide plastic service ware to any
- 16 customer.
- (c) Unless otherwise exempted pursuant to section 339-D,
- 18 no food packager shall package meat, eggs, bakery products, or
- 19 other food in any polystyrene foam container that is
- 20 manufactured with the use of or containing chlorofluorocarbons.
- 21 The department may require the manufacturer or supplier of the



- 1 container used by the food packager to furnish a written
- 2 statement from the manufacturer of the packaging, indicating
- 3 that use of the container is not prohibited.
- 4 §342G-D Single-use plastics; exemptions. The department
- 5 may grant an exemption from compliance section 342G-C, upon
- 6 application and a showing by the applicant that compliance with
- 7 prohibitions of section 342G-C would cause undue hardship. For
- 8 purposes of this section, "undue hardship" shall include
- 9 situations in which:
- 10 (1) There are no acceptable alternatives to packaging with
- 11 polystyrene foam containers for reasons that are
- unique to the applicant; or
- 13 (2) Compliance with section 342G-C would deprive a person
- of a legally protected right.
- 15 §342G-E Penalties and injunctive relief. (a) Any
- 16 business that violates any provision of this article or any rule
- 17 adopted pursuant to this chapter shall be:
- 18 (1) Ordered to discontinue the distribution of bags
- 19 prohibited by this chapter at the point of sale; and
- 20 (2) Subject to a civil fine of not less than \$100 and not
- 21 more than \$1,000 for each day of violation.



1 The director may initiate a civil action in any court of competent jurisdiction for injunctive or other relief to: 2 3 Correct or abate violations of this chapter or any rule adopted pursuant to this chapter; 4 5 (2) Collect administrative penalties; or 6 (3) Obtain other relief. 7 §342G-F Rules. The director shall adopt rules pursuant to 8 chapter 91 for purposes of implementation, administration, and 9 enforcement of this chapter." 10 SECTION 2. Section 342G-63, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 11 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows: 12 "(b) All moneys collected pursuant to section 342G-B and 13 section 342G-62 shall be deposited into the environmental 14 management special fund. All interest earned or accrued on 15 moneys deposited into the fund shall become a part of the fund." 16 SECTION 3. In codifying the new sections added by section 17 1 of this Act, the revisor of statutes shall substitute 18 appropriate section numbers for the letters used in designating 19 the new sections in this Act.

- 1 SECTION 4. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 2 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 3 begun before its effective date.
- 4 SECTION 5. If any provision of this Act, or the
- 5 application thereof to any person or circumstance, is held
- 6 invalid, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or
- 7 applications of the Act that can be given effect without the
- 8 invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions
- 9 of this Act are severable.
- 10 SECTION 6. New statutory material is underscored.
- 11 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2020.
